

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



Outback Spirit makes a significant yearly donation to AWC

Australia is world renowned for its unique wildlife and the beautiful yet fragile habitats in which they live. What many people don't realise, however, is that Australia has the highest mammal extinction rate in the world.

Since European colonisation approximately 10% of Australia's mammals have become extinct. Globally, this figure makes up one-third of mammal extinctions over the past 200 years. This terrible track record is made worse by the fact that most Australian mammals aren't found anywhere else in the world.

As an outback tour operator, Outback Spirit relies on the natural environment. As such, we're big believers in supporting organisations such as AWC that actively protect Australia's threatened wildlife and ecosystems. Since 2008, we've donated over one million dollars to AWC in support of their incredible efforts to halt Australia's extinction rate. This significant figure is added to each and every year and makes a real difference to their operations.



AWC is a not-for-profit organisation funded by donations. This financial support enables vital programs aimed at protecting Australia's most endangered species.


AWC programs combined with world-class science enables them to take action by:

- 1. Acquiring land to establish sanctuaries for the conservation of threatened species and ecosystems.
- 2. Implementing practical, on-ground conservation programs such as the eradication of feral animals and the reintroduction of endangered species.
- 3. Conducting scientific research into key issues affecting biodiversity in Australia.
- Undertaking public education programs to promote awareness of the plight of Australia's wildlife.

AWC currently owns and manages 29 sanctuaries covering over 16 million acres across Australia, including iconic locations such as the Kimberley, Top End, Cape York and Lake Eyre. These sanctuaries protect a significant proportion of Australia's biodiversity, including 88% of all bird species and 72% of all mammal species. AWC protects more terrestrial animal species than any other non-government conservation organisation in Australia.

Indigenous Employment

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In remote areas, Outback Spirit seeks to offer employment to local Aboriginal people where possible. Often employed as tour guides, there's simply no better way of learning about Aboriginal culture than first hand from Traditional Owners. Their intimate knowledge of the landscape and seasons and their Dreamtime stories make for a fascinating and enlightening cultural experience. We also offer other tourism and hospitality positions at our remote camps, along with the appropriate training. These employment opportunities benefit the local community and improve Outback Spirit's cultural tourism products.

Supporting Indigenous Businesses

Outback Spirit's tour operations provide valuable support for Indigenous owned and operated businesses. Whether it's a visit to an art centre or the support of an Indigenous owned accommodation facility or store, the revenue from our tours is significant in the overall viability of these businesses. During the construction and renovation stages of our new camps and lodges in Arnhem Land, many Indigenous Corporations provided staff, machinery and expertise on a contractual basis with ongoing business relationships being developed.

Sponsorships

Outback Spirit sponsors football clubs in remote Aboriginal communities in Arnhem Land, including Maningrida and Ramingining. This sponsorship is aimed at encouraging the youth from these communities to lead healthy lifestyles and to support those who work hard as volunteers in their vital roles in remote sporting competitions. In addition to sport, Outback Spirit also contributes to education and training. In the Kimberley, we help sponsor teachers for the Kandiwal Aboriginal Community on the Mitchell Plateau and provide accommodation and board free of charge at our safari camp.



Outback Spirit have a long history of operating tours in the remote Kimberley region, beginning way back in the late 1990's. Early on, we ran air safaris and large coach tours before starting small group 4WD adventures in the year 2000. From a humble pair of 14-seat OKA's (Australian made 4WD bus) we've grown to become one of the largest tourism operators in the Kimberley. With the establishment of our safari camp in 2011, we own and operate the Kimberley's most luxurious tented accommodation facility up on the Mitchell Plateau.

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With Outback Spirit, you'll enjoy unsurpassed access to the remote Kimberley thanks to a network of unique wilderness lodges and local partnerships. Strategically located, these accommodation bases make it possible to explore the furthest corners of the Kimberley, including the stunning Mitchell Plateau. Here, guests enjoy two nights at our exquisite Ngauwudu Safari Camp, exclusive to Outback Spirit guests, which is also operated during the wet season.

Exclusive intimate lodges



At Mornington Wildlife Sanctuary there can only ever be one tour group in-house at any one time, while our very own Ngauwudu Safari Camp on the Mitchell Plateau has undergone a multi-million dollar upgrade and is exclusive to Outback Spirit guests with each luxury safari suite positioned to offer seclusion and privacy.

Kimberley Wonders

Comprehensive itineraries that feature the very best of the Kimberley

The Mitchell Plateau

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A journey to the Kimberley would not be complete without venturing north to the stunning Mitchell Plateau. All of Outback Spirit's itineraries include a visit to this remote and spectacular corner of the Kimberley, home to the stunning Mitchell Falls. Enjoy a guided walk to the falls with expert guides, viewing rarely seen rock art galleries along the way. Every tour we operate to the region includes a scenic helicopter flight over the falls and back to the ranger station at the end of the walk.

Horizontal Falls

The Horizontal Falls have been described by Sir David Attenborough as 'one of the greatest natural wonders of the world'. Lying deep within the Buccaneer Archipelago at Talbot Bay, the 2nd largest tides in the world hurtle through two narrow coastal gorges to create a 'horizontal waterfall' effect. The half day tour with Horizontal Falls Seaplane Adventures (valued at \$995pp) begins with a flight aboard an amphibious Cessna Grand Caravan. Land on the calm waters of Talbot Bay and enjoy an exhilarating jet-boat ride through the falls!

Note: This attraction is included in our dry season expeditions to the Kimberley but can be removed. Please contact our office for details.

The Bungle Bungles

World Heritage listed in 2003, the Bungle Bungles are one of the highlights of any trip to the Kimberley. Characterised by orange and black beehive shaped domes, the park is simply breathtaking and a delight for avid photographers. It's also home to Cathedral Gorge, one of the most incredible in northern Australia and reached by a walking trail along Piccaninny Creek, as well as Echidna Chasm.

All Outback Spirit adventures that visit the Bungle Bungles include an 18-minute scenic helicopter flight valued at \$299pp

Ord River Cruise

This is without question the best river cruise you can do in Australia! Enjoy the incredible landscape between Kununurra and Lake Argyle as you cruise along in high powered boats with expert skippers and insightful commentary about the river's ecology and the massive Ord River Irrigation Scheme. There's even time for a quick afternoon tea break on the banks of the river.

Ancient Rock Art

The Kimberley is home to some exceptional rock art, including the Wandjina figures and the dramatic Gwion Gwion art. With Outback Spirit you'll see this art on all of our itineraries and enjoy expert interpretation from our knowledgeable guides. Located primarily in the north Kimberley, this art can be seen on the walk to Mitchell Falls and at King Edward River on the Mitchell Plateau track.









Ngauwudu Safari Camp

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Built exclusively for Outback Spirit guests, Ngauwudu Safari Camp allows for an in-depth exploration of the stunning Mitchell Plateau

Built exclusively for Outback Spirit guests, Ngauwudu Safari Camp allows for an in-depth exploration of the stunning Mitchell Plateau. Ngauwudu (pronounced Nar-woo-doo) is the Aboriginal name for the Mitchell Plateau, a striking and untouched wilderness in the North Kimberley. Outback Spirit's safari camp is one of only two permanent camps on Ngauwudu and is by far the most luxurious and spacious.

Ngauwudu was expanded and renewed for the 2022 touring season with a multi-million dollar upgrade and the addition of 8 brand new 'Safari Suites'. The original 'Safari Suites' have all been beautifully re-furnished with brand new furniture, fittings and bedding. This, along with private ensuites, crisp laundered linen, full insect screening and a wide verandah with outdoor furniture makes for an even more luxurious experience. The Wawida Pavilion, home to Ngauwudu Safari Camps' restaurant and bar has also been transformed with updated dining facilities, cosy lounge and extended alfresco area, perfect for relaxing during the day or night.

Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge

Immerse yourself in Purnululu with a two night stay at this ideally positioned safari lodge

Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge is the most established accommodation within the World Heritage Listed Purnululu National Park (the Bungle Bungles). Located in the south of the park on Bellburn Creek, the lodge features 28 architecturally designed cabins scattered in a bush setting. There's also a licensed restaurant and outdoor bar area overlooking the creek, an ideal spot for a cool drink at the end of the day. Come the evening, enjoy delicious home-style meals and relax around the campfire, sharing your adventures with new friends.

Interestingly enough, the Bungle Bungles were in fact a secret to the outside world until about 1983. Although recently upgraded, Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge was one of the original safari facilities in the park and is still the most ideal spot from which to explore this fascinating geological landmark. It's close to all of the park's highlights, including Cathedral Gorge and Piccaninny Creek, and is one of only a handful of accommodation facilities in the area.

As you would expect, being located in a World Heritage listed environment comes with stringent eco guidelines. The lodge features both solar power and a sensitive waste water treatment system to minimise its impact on this fragile and beautiful part of the Kimberley.

In 2017 Outback Spirit became a 50% owner of the Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge, in partnership with Aviair in Kununurra.

Mornington Wildlife Sanctuary

A naturalist's paradise on the upper Fitzroy River

Mornington Wildlife Sanctuary is an 800,000 acre former cattle station turned wildlife sanctuary. Located right in the middle of the Kimberley in the upper Fitzroy River catchment, the Sanctuary is a vital refuge for wildlife and protects over 200 species of birds, including the Gouldian Finch and Purple-crowned Fairy-wren. It's owned and operated by AWC (Australian Wildlife Conservancy), a non-profit organisation dedicated to saving Australia's precious wildlife. Mornington also serves as an operational base for the AWC's broader conservation programs in the Kimberley, which includes other stations such as Marion Downs and Artesian Range.







Jandamarra

1873 - 1897

Jandamarra was a young Aboriginal man of the Bunuba tribe, who grew up in the late 1800's in the remote landscapes of the Kimberley. At the time, pastoralists were staking claim in Australia's northwest causing conflict with Aboriginal people living a traditional life on country.

Around age 10, Jandamarra went with his mother to live on Lennard Station, one of the earliest pastoral stations of the Kimberley. He learned skills in shooting, horse riding and shearing. Years later, Jandamarra developed a close friendship with settler Bill Richardson, whilst living at Lillimooloora Station. When Richardson joined the police force, Jandamarra followed and was recruited as a skilled tracker.

Whilst Richardson and Jandamarra made a formidable pair, their two worlds collided when they captured a group of Bunuba people, including members of Jandamarra's own family. Unable to betray his people, Jandamarra defected and shot Richardson dead. He then led a three-year armed resistance against European settlers and authorities across some of the Kimberley's most picturesque settings, including Windjana Gorge and Tunnel Creek.

Jandamarra eluded police by using his knowledge of country and earned himself a reputation as a warrior amongst his people. He was eventually tracked down and killed at Tunnel Creek in 1897. He was only in his mid-twenties but had created a legacy that has not been forgotten.

The adventure begins as we depart Broome for Derby, arriving late afternoon. Visit the Boab Prison Tree and Myalls Bore & Cattle Trough before checking in to the 4-star Spinifex Hotel. Meals: L.D

Day 2

Gibb River Road - Bell Gorge - Mornington

Once a large cattle station, Mornington is owned and operated by Australian Wildlife Conservancy (AWC). It's one of the largest non-government protected areas in Australia and a vital refuge for wildlife protecting over 200 species of birds, 104 species of reptiles, 43 mammals and 22 amphibians. For the next two nights we stay in unique safari tents overlooking Annie Creek. Enjoy a few drinks around the campfire before dinner. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Exploring Mornington



This morning we explore the vast wilderness of Mornington Wildlife Sanctuary in open back safari vehicles. Enjoy an informative ecology tour with commentary on AWC's conservation programs to protect threatened Kimberley species. Enjoy a picnic lunch and cool dip at Cadjeput waterhole on the upper Fitzroy River.

This afternoon we return to the wilderness camp where the remainder of the day can be spent at your leisure. Tonight, enjoy an outdoor slide show from AWC ecologists. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4

Galvans Gorge – Gibb River Rd – Drysdale



This morning we return to the Gibb River Road, stopping for a swim and to explore Galvans Gorge before continuing north on the Kalumburu Road. Later this afternoon we arrive at Drysdale River Station, which runs 9000 head of cattle across more than 1 million acres. We spend the night in top quality station cabins with private ensuite bathrooms. Meals: B.L.D

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Day 5 King Edward River - Mitchell Plateau

We then check in to our very own Ngauwudu Safari Camp, which was freshly refurbished for the 2022 touring season. Built exclusively for Outback Spirit guests, it's truly a magical spot for the next two nights of our adventure and the ideal base from which to discover 'Ngauwudu' (Mitchell Plateau).

Day 9

Wyndham – Five Rivers Lookout – Parry Lagoons – Emma Gorge Walk

In some places the walls of the gorge stand up to 100m above the wide alluvial floodplain below. Enjoy a guided walk through the gorge with your tour leaders before a picnic lunch.

This afternoon we head further along the Windiana Way to Tunnel Creek. We then land at the Faraway Bay airstrip, where we'll be greeted by their friendly team and transferred to the lodge, our home for the next two nights.

The rustic yet comfortable cabins feature ensuite bathrooms, air-conditioning and stunning views of the bay.

Faraway Bay is an award winning coastal lodge nestled on a rocky hilltop overlooking the turquoise Timor Sea.

Located 280 kilometres north-west of Kununurra, this far north area of Western Australia is a remote and spellbinding part of the Kimberley. With King George Falls just a short boat trip away, this unique wilderness retreat offers an experience you will never forget.

This afternoon is free for you to relax and absorb this magical location. Perhaps enjoy a swim in the pool with views over the Timor Sea! Later in the afternoon savour some sunset drinks and experience the usual wet season lightning display before an appetising dinner in Eagle Lodge. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 King George Falls Marine Adventure -Barramundi Fishing



Waking up at Faraway Bay is an experience itself. As birds sing their dawn chorus, the morning sun lights up the dramatic escarpment across the bay. And to really get the day off on the right foot, each cabin features a private outdoor shower with views over the stunning coastal landscape. There is simply no better way to start the day!

After breakfast in Eagle Lodge, it's time to head off on what can only be described as one of the best marine adventures in Western Australia. The King George River, located just 30 minutes away by boat, tumbles over the edge of 100m high sandstone cliffs to create WA's highest twin waterfalls. During the dry season, it's a spectacular sight. In the Wet, it's simply mind boggling! The sheer volume of water tumbling off the plateau has to be seen to be believed. As the falls plunge into the Timor Sea, it truly creates a once in a lifetime, awe-inspiring spectacle. From a cultural point of view, the river is highly significant to the Balanggarra people. To them, the Falls are the male and female Wunkurr (Rainbow Serpents).

To get to the falls, your skipper will meander the boat up-river between the massive sandstone cliffs either side, all whilst giving detailed commentary. There's even a swimming hole to visit along the way! Enjoy lunch on the river and soak up this incredible part of the Kimberley before returning to Faraway Bay early in the afternoon. On the cruise back to the lodge, you'll also have the opportunity to throw a line in and try your luck for a Barramundi.

Upon returning to Faraway Bay the rest of the afternoon can be spent at your leisure. Take a walk along the beach, go for a swim in the delightful swimming pool, or relax in Eagle Lodge. Gather for drinks later this afternoon for the lightning show, and look to the escarpment for the many little waterfalls which come to life in the Wet. Meals: B.L.D

Mitchell Plateau ('Ngauwudu') & Mitchell River National Park



This morning we head back to the airstrip for our 45-minute scenic flight to yet another iconic part of the Kimberley; the Mitchell Plateau. Home to the fourtiered Mitchell Falls and exquisite rock art

galleries, the Mitchell Plateau is a truly unique part of the Kimberley. With all roads into the area closed at this time of year, the region is only accessible by aircraft

Upon our arrival on the Mitchell Plateau we'll be transferred to our exclusive Ngauwudu Safari Camp, where we'll spend the next 3 nights. Check in and enjoy lunch before a familiarisation tour of the camp, including the private palm fringed swimming hole. This afternoon is free for you to relax before dinner in the restaurant. Meals: B.L.D

Day 5 Hunter River - Donkin Falls - Indian Head - Mitchell Falls



Today is all about experiencing the Mitchell River National Park by air. With most tracks in the area impassable due to swollen rivers, our main mode of transport for the next couple of days will be by helicopter, an exclusively chartered Bell Long Ranger. However, some of the areas we visit are only ever accessible by helicopter, regardless of the time of year.

Our first scenic helicopter flight takes us to the south west of the Mitchell Plateau to the mouth of the Hunter River. The scenery



in this area is truly breathtaking! You'll fly over Donkin Falls, Indian Head and the upper reaches of the Hunter River before flying east towards the majestic Mitchell Falls. We'll fly over the Mitchell Falls themselves, and after a couple of passes we'll land and prepare for our ground tour.

There are four tiers to the Mitchell Falls and each one can generally be defined from the viewing area. However, during the wet season these 4 tiers turn into 1 or 2 tiers thanks to the sheer amount of water flowing down the Mitchell River. The view from both the air and the ground can only be described as sensational.

After the ground tour and some morning tea we'll board our helicopter again for a scenic flight back to the camp for lunch. This afternoon, head off on a 4WD ground tour to the impressive Lawley River lookout. Travel through the palm forests of the Mitchell Plateau and learn about the cultural significance of this special area. If available, we'll be accompanied by a local Indigenous guide from the Kandiwal Community.

We return to camp late afternoon and enjoy another lightning show before sitting down for dinner under the floodlit Bloodwood tree. Meals: B.L.D

Day 6 Lower Mitchell Falls Art Site -**Coastal Scenic flight**



This morning we embark on our third scenic helicopter flight, flying down to the lower Mitchell Falls. This area is home to a number of stunning art galleries, some of which are among the most graphic in the Kimberley.

Our expert guide will interpret the art work and give you a fascinating insight into its significance.

After visiting various art sites, we board the helicopter for our fourth scenic flight, this time taking in some of the magical Kimberley coastline. Following the Mitchell River, we'll fly over Crystal Creek and out over Port Warrender before returning to the safari camp. Once back in camp, the afternoon can be spent at your leisure. Enjoy a swim or simply relax in your safari suite before dinner. Meals: B.L.D

Day 7 Mitchell Plateau - Darwin



After breakfast, we bid farewell to Ngauwudu and head to the airstrip for our 2-hour scenic flight back to Darwin. Upon arrival at the General Aviation terminal we'll be transferred to the DoubleTree by Hilton for the final night of our adventure.



ARNHEM LAND

The wildest place you've never seen

Arnhem Land is Aboriginal Land, a vast and spectacular region that few people have ever stepped foot in. These sacred lands have been inhabited by Aboriginal people for over 60,000 years, making their culture the oldest surviving culture in human history.

Occupying the northeast corner of the Northern Territory, Arnhem Land extends from the Roper River in the Gulf, right around the east and north coasts of the Northern Territory to the border of Kakadu National Park. With an area of 97,000 square kilometres, it's 50% bigger than Tasmania but with a population of less than 20,000.

The landscapes of Arnhem Land are truly awe-inspiring. Enormous freshwater swamps, imposing rocky escarpments, untouched rivers and fluorescent blue waters lapping the coastline, make up what can only be described as a breath-taking natural environment. Then there's the unique wildlife that abounds in these stunning natural wonders, free from the pressures of mass tourism, agriculture and development.

It's very much a privilege to be able to showcase this extraordinary part of Australia to our guests. We hope you'll join us in 2023 and discover the mystery and spirit of Arnhem Land.





Wonggu Mununggurr

1880 - 1959

Wonggu Mununggurr was an Elder of the Djapu clan from Caledon Bay, in the north-eastern region of Arnhem Land. He became a well-known Aboriginal leader, who led resistance to incursions into Arnhem Land before the establishment of the Methodist Yirrkala Mission.

In 1933, when a crew of Japanese and European fishing boats sailed into Caledon Bay to gather trepang, they were attacked by members of Wonggu's clan, leaving only one survivor. Once the occurrence was reported in Darwin, Wonggu's name caught the imagination of the press and he became a prominent figure in what became known as the Caledon Bay massacre. Three of Wonggu's sons were implicated in the assault and imprisoned for twenty years.

As a result, Donald Thomson, a young anthropologist, volunteered to go alone into Arnhem Land and live among the Aboriginal people to help resolve the conflict. He lived with the Yolngu people and developed a close relationship with Wonggu, who gave him a message stick to take back to the government. Wonggu agreed to keep the peace in return for the release of his sons and respect of Yolngu culture.

With the outbreak of World War II, Thomson again joined with Wonggu and his sons. Ironically, this time to form a special Aboriginal Reconnaissance Unit to protect Australia's north coast against invasion from the Japanese. Wonggu died on 7 June 1959 at Yirrkala.

Thomson described Wonggu as a 'gallant warrior' who drew attention to the issues of Aboriginal justice and rights to land.

Your journey

Day 1 Welcome to Arnhem Land



Upon your arrival in Nhulunbuy today you'll be met by your professional Tour Director. This afternoon we'll explore this frontier village, created in the 1960's after the discovery of Bauxite on the Gove Peninsula. Visit the Roy (Malpi) Marika Lookout for incredible views towards the coast, Gayngaru Wetlands and Gove Harbour before settling in for a two-night stay at the Walkabout Lodge. *Meals: D*

Day 2 Exploring the Gove Peninsula



The Gove Peninsula has been home to Yolngu people for over 60,000 years and is one of the most culturally significant regions in Australia. You'll get a true sense of this with a special 'Welcome to Country' ceremony at Wirrwawuy Beach, where we'll learn about Yolngu culture and kinship first hand.

We then visit the Buku-Larrnggay Mulka art centre in Yirrkala, which boasts many renowned Aboriginal artists whose work can be found in galleries all over the world. Yirrkala is also where the Aboriginal Land Rights movement started, when the 'bark petition' was sent to federal parliament in 1963.

From the art centre it's a short drive to Shady Beach for lunch and a special Bush Medicine and Women's Healing demonstration. Experience traditional healing ways and hear stories of how Yolngu live and heal on their land.

This afternoon we visit Macassan Beach for an interpretive walk and learn about the fascinating trade relations between the Yolngu and Macassans, who negotiated the right to fish for native trepang in Australian waters. This trade relationship dates as far back as the 1400's and lasted until the beginning of the 20th century. We return to Nhulunbuy and the Walkabout Lodge late this afternoon. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Journey to Murwangi

Today our journey into the heart of Arnhem Land begins. Departing Nhulunbuy we follow the Central Arnhem road south west to the Goyder River, the main tributary flowing into the massive Arafura Swamp. Enjoy a picnic lunch before taking a track to the north, which follows an escarpment before descending on to the Arafura floodplains. Known as Murwangi, this area is home to our exclusive safari camp where we'll be staying for the next two nights. Check in to your deluxe safari suite before dinner in the lodge dining room. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4 Arafura Swamp and Murwangi Discovery Tour



The Arafura Swamp is one of the largest wooded swamps in Australia and covers approximately 1,300 square kilometres. This incredibly diverse wetland can support up to 300,000 water birds at any one time, including Magpie Geese, Egrets, Black-necked Stork and Brolgas. The swamp is of great cultural significance to Yolngu People and was also the location for the 2006 film 'Ten Canoes'.

Today enjoy a tranquil cruise on the main lagoon, followed by a 4WD adventure around the edge of the swamp. For both activities, we'll be accompanied by Indigenous guides who'll explain why this spectacular area is so significant to them.

Later this afternoon we return to the safari camp, with a little free time before dinner. Meals: B.L.D

Day 5 Ramingining – Barramundi Lodge



This morning we visit the Bula'bula Art Centre in Ramingining. Chat to local artists as they paint right in front of you. (Artwork can be purchased if desired).

After morning tea, we head further west towards Maningrida, crossing the Blyth and Cadell rivers before arriving at the Arnhem Land Barramundi Lodge. Recognised as one of Australia's premier fishing destinations, the lodge holds exclusive fishing licences for various waterways and coastal areas, including the Liverpool River.

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Day 7 Maningrida to Mount Borradaile



Today our travels take us through the stone country of west Arnhem Land. Cross the Liverpool and Goomadeer Rivers before arriving at the turnoff to Davidson's Arnhem Land Safaris, Mount Borradaile. From here we travel along a 40km bush track into the safari lodge, arriving in time for lunch. We'll then check in to our cabins, our home for the next two nights.

This afternoon the highly trained staff at Mount Borradaile will take you through 50,000 years of Aboriginal culture in a truly awe-inspiring landscape. The area contains some of the most stunning rock art galleries in the world, and in terms of artistic quality, quantity, colour and state of preservation it is virtually unrivalled. The walls of the many rock shelters are decorated with innumerable pictures documenting traditional Aboriginal life over many thousands of years. Subjects range from now extinct animals to twentieth century sailing ships and the iconic rainbow serpent.

Following this afternoon's activities we return to the lodge and prepare for dinner. Meals: B.L.D

Cobourg Peninsula - Seven Spirit Bay



Departing Mount Borradaile early, we head north and venture into Garia Gunak Barlu National Park on the Cobourg Peninsula. Travel up the eastern side of Port Essington to Black Point, where we'll meet the marine crew from Seven Spirit Bay for the short transfer across Port Essington. Upon arriving at the lodge you'll be allocated your room for the next three nights, a unique and luxurious 'habitat' overlooking Coral Bay.

We meet again later this evening for dinner in the restaurant. Meals: B.L.D

Day 10 Port Essington & The Historic Victoria Settlement



Today we enjoy a marine adventure down Port Essington aboard the lodge's specially designed vessel MV Arafura. Designed by NAIAD in New Zealand and built in Australia, these amazing vessels are the ultimate marine sightseeing craft.

Departing Seven Spirit Bay, we retrace the course of the early mariner's square riggers, passing landmarks like Gunners Quoin, Low Point, Turtle Rock, and Observation Cliff on our way to historic Victoria Settlement. Surveyed in 1838, Victoria Settlement was the third attempt by the British at a northern settlement after Fort Dundas on Melville Island, and Fort Wellington at Raffles Bay. Conceived to facilitate trade with Asia, the settlement consisted of 24 houses and a hospital. Disease was rampant and living conditions poor, leading to its abandonment in 1849.

Upon our arrival at Victoria Settlement we'll take an informative and fascinating tour of the old buildings and ruins, learning about life in the early British occupation. There's an optional extension to the walk which leads to lonely gravestones in the forest, almost forgotten by history. After a picnic lunch on the beach we'll get on the water again and enjoy a leisurely cruise back to Seven Spirit Bay. The waters of the Cobourg Marine Park are alive, so keep your eye out for dolphins, dugong, manta rays and crocodiles.

Once back at Seven Spirit Bay, the rest of the afternoon can be spent at your leisure. Relax in your villa, take a dip in the palm fringed swimming pool, or alternatively head back out on the water for a fish with your marine guides. Tonight, enjoy sunset drinks from the verandah before dinner in the restaurant. Meals: B.L.D.





The Cobourg Marine Park sanctuary is teeming with barramundi, Spanish mackerel, golden trevally and coral trout to name just a few. After breakfast, we board the lodge's state-of-the-art fishing vessels for an exclusive half-day fishing adventure around Port Essington. Each vessel features a restroom, shade canopy and comfortable seating. Best of all they only take 6 people, so everyone can enjoy having a fish.

Seven Spirit Bay's fishing guides are true professionals. They'll take you to the best fishing spots, and along the way share their marine sanctuary expertise while enjoying some of the most spectacular coastline to be found in northern Australia. You'll be given all the gear and advice required to reel in one of the many sought after fish species in these stunning waters. Once we've tested our luck, we'll make our way to a sheltered beach landing where we disembark and rendezvous with the lodge's sous chef for a delicious bush picnic.

After lunch we enjoy a 4WD safari to appreciate the wonders of Garig Gunak Barlu National Park. First up is a visit to the stunning Nipa Palm gallery (Nypa Fruticans), one of only three locations in Australia where they can be found (the others are Melville Island and the Wenlock River in far North OLD). Next, we'll explore the savannah lands of Vashon Head, spotting banteng and buffalo before a visit to Gunners Quoin. We return to the lodge late afternoon for our third and final evening at Seven Spirit Bay. Meals: B.L.D

Please note: The timings for the Port Essington fishing adventure are dependent on tidal movements. As such, lunch arrangements are subject to change to suit the itinerary set by the Seven Spirit Bay marine managers.

This morning you have the option of taking another fishing adventure or heading off on a 4WD safari to Rainbow Beach. After lunch we depart for the airstrip and board our Cessna Grand Caravan for the 45-minute scenic flight across Van Diemen Gulf to Darwin. This stateof-the-art 14 seat aircraft was purchased new by Outback Spirit in 2018 and is operated by our wholly owned subsidiary, Spirit Aviation. The aircraft features airconditioning, leather seats, advanced avionics and trusted turbine reliability.

Once in Darwin we'll be transferred to the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel, perfectly positioned along the Esplanade. Enjoy the rest of the afternoon at your leisure before boarding the Charles Darwin for a delicious Territory-style sunset dinner cruise and celebrate a truly amazing trip! Meals: B.L.D



THE PILBARA & SOUTH WEST

Mother Nature at her finest

Known for its abundance of natural resources, the Pilbara region of WA covers an area six times greater than Tasmania. It's a vast, richly endowed and stunningly beautiful part of Australia. Deep in its heart you'll marvel at rugged red gorges, crystal-clear pools and hidden waterfalls of Karijini and Millstream-Chichester National Parks.

Along the stunning Coral Coast, natural wonders abound including Ningaloo, one of the largest fringing reefs on earth that's home to an abundance of marine life. There's also World Heritage Listed Shark Bay, with its friendly dolphins and vast seagrass meadows that support one of the world's largest dugong populations.

In the bottom half of Western Australia, the world's largest collection of wildflowers goes on display each spring. Amazingly, 60 percent of them are found nowhere else on Earth. The wineries of Margaret River, with a backdrop of ocean and forest, are also a highlight for visitors to the region. Throw in the tall forests of Pemberton, the cosmopolitan city of Fremantle plus a host of stunning national parks and it's easy to see why people flock to the South West.





Sir Norman Brearley

1890 - 1989

Norman Brearley was born in Geelong in 1890 and went on to become one of the most significant contributors to Australian aviation. He trained as an engineering apprentice in Perth before joining the Royal Flying Corps in Britain when war broke out in 1914.

During his time over the Western Front, Brearley was awarded the Military Cross for destroying a German observation balloon, and the Distinguished Service Order after being shot down and crawling back to Allied lines whilst seriously wounded.

He returned to Australia with two warsurplus Avro bi-planes with the intention of establishing an air-service in Western Australia. He won the Geraldton to Derby airmail service contract and founded Western Australian Airways Ltd (later becoming West Australian Airways).

In 1927 Brearley established the Perth Flying School at Mayland's Aerodrome, the birthplace of commercial aviation in Western Australia, and became the founding President of the Royal Aero Club of Western Australia.

In 1934, Brearley lost the north-west mail contract to MacRobertson-Miller Aviation Company. Two years later, he sold the airline to a group who would become Australian National Airways and down the track, Ansett Airways (then Ansett Australia).

During the Second World War, Brearley joined the RAAF and served as the Commanding Officer of several flight training schools. His contribution to the aviation industry was fundamental and he was knighted in 1971. His bust is displayed at Perth International Airport.

Then, it's on to New Norcia where we'll take a guided tour of Australia's only monastic town and admire its unique Mediterranean architecture. Hudson Fysh

1895 - 1974

Born in Launceston, Tasmania, Hudson Fysh was an Australian aviator and businessman. At the beginning of World War I, he enlisted and served in the Australian Flying Corps as an air gunner, awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for his gallantry. He gained his pilot wings in 1919 and along with Australian pilot, Paul McGinness, was commissioned to survey the Darwin to Longreach section of the Britain-Australia Air Race. This journey led to the formation of Queensland & Northern Territory Aerial Services Ltd (QANTAS) in November 1920.

Along with McGinness, Fysh flew charter and joy-riding flights to raise capital. McGinness provided much of the initial drive to establish Qantas and was instrumental in securing the involvement of Sir Fergus McMaster, the first Chairman of Qantas who lobbied successfully for a Commonwealth air mail subsidy. Fysh took on the role of General Manager of the company and was responsible for overseeing the steady growth of the young airline.

The company gradually expanded and in 1930 moved its headquarters to Brisbane. It soon gained valuable mail contracts and extended its service overseas, with Qantas operating the Singapore-Australia air route trading as Qantas Empire Airways. Six years later Fysh became a Director of Tasman Empire Airways Ltd, which flew to and from New Zealand.

In 1947 the Commonwealth acquired the company but Fysh remained Managing Director. He was Chairman until 1966, by which time the company had become established as one of the world's leading airlines. Fysh was knighted in June 1953 for his services to civil aviation.

Jackey Jackey (Galmarra) was a young Aboriginal guide who gained a reputation for his hard work, excellent bush craft and reliability during the Kennedy Expedition of 1848 to explore Far North Queensland. He was a member of the Merton district tribe near Muswellbrook in the Hunter Valley, and was a young boy when selected to accompany Edmund Kennedy on his expedition.

During the expedition, Kennedy's party was gradually overcome by disease and deprivation caused by the harsh tropical landscape conditions, but Jackey Jackey emerged as one of its strongest members. When the party was left behind at Weymouth Bay, he and Kennedy advanced towards Cape York; first with three others, then alone. Before reaching the supply ship HMS *Ariel* off Albany Island, they were attacked by Aboriginal people and Kennedy was killed. Jackey Jackey managed to escape and persevered to reach the ship.

Jackey Jackey's bond with Kennedy was again displayed in May 1849 when he served as a guide for a rescue party with Captain T. Beckford Simpson, to search for survivors and locate Kennedy's body. They were unsuccessful, but Simpson praised Jackey Jackey's skill and devotion to Kennedy's memory. He also uncannily referred to Jackey Jackey's one weakness, a 'fondness for ardent spirits'.

On returning, Jackey Jackey was honoured for his achievements and service. He rejoined his tribe but eventually drifted, and in 1854 during an overland journey not far from Albury, he fell into his camp fire and tragically died.





After a wilderness cruise on the Daintree River, Outback Spirit passengers get to explore Cooper Creek Wilderness below Thornton Peak, the epicentre of refugial significance in the ancient Daintree. Far removed from mass tourism, you'll walk through pristine old growth rainforest with no other tourists in sight.

Torres Strait Islands

Between the tip of continental Australia and the island of New Guinea lies the Torres Strait, home to at least 274 islands, most of which are part of Queensland. Outback Spirit passengers enjoy comprehensive touring in the Torres Strait, including guided tours of both Thursday Island and Horn Island. Lotusbird Lodge

Overlooking a tranquil lagoon near the edge of Lakefield National Park, Lotusbird Lodge is a delightful location to slow down and absorb the beauty of the peninsula. Featuring individual pole style timber cabins, the lodge is set amongst shady eucalypts along the inner bank of a large horseshoe shaped billabong. Each cabin features an ensuite bathroom, comfortable furnishings and a private balcony.

Lotusbird Lodge was named after the Jacana (Lotusbirds) that inhabit the surrounding billabongs. The local environment ranges from open eucalypt woodland and gallery forests to grassy plains, marshlands, creeks and lagoons, providing the ideal habitat for over 200 species of birds, including several which are endemic to Cape York.

Outback Spirit is the only tour operator to enjoy two nights in this tranquil location.

Moreton Wilderness Lodge

Located between Weipa and Bamaga on the Overland Telegraph Track, Moreton Wilderness Lodge is Outback Spirit's very own accommodation facility in Cape York. The lodge is situated adjacent to the historic Moreton Telegraph Station, a repeater station for the Overland Telegraph Line (OTL) established in the 1880's. Set within a shady eucalypt forest, the lodge enjoys an enviable location alongside the wild and pristine Wenlock River, which is home to more species of freshwater fish than any other river in Australia.

Accommodation at our Moreton Wilderness Lodge is comprised of modern cabins featuring ensuite bathrooms, air-conditioning and shady verandahs. Each cabin has recently undergone a refurbishment with updated furnishings, beds and bedding ensuring a comfortable setting for your two night stay. Included in our 13-day Cape York Wilderness Adventure is a breathtaking 45-minute helicopter flight over the largest national park on the peninsula – Rinyirru (Lakefield). The exclusively chartered Bell Jet-Ranger allows for a bird's eye view of Rinyirru's swamps, lagoons, rivers and woodlands which dominate the park. Spot crocodiles from the air as well as incredible birdlife, kangaroos and wild cattle. You'll follow the Kennedy River all the way to Princess Charlotte Bay, infamously remembered for Queensland's worst maritime disaster in 1899 when Cyclone Mahina wiped out the entire North Queensland pearling fleet.

In addition to seeing Rinyirru from the air, Outback Spirit passengers also explore the park from ground level. After departing Laura, we enter the park from the southern end and travel north, passing the Old Laura Homestead before arriving at Kalpowar on the banks of the Normanby River. After a picnic lunch, we continue on to the Hann River before driving across Nifold Plains, home to a stunning vista of magnetic termite mounds. The journey through the park concludes on arrival at Lotusbird Lodge for a relaxing two night stay overlooking a tranquil lagoon.

Day 1 Cairns - Port Douglas

This afternoon we venture further into the World Heritage Listed Daintree, the oldest and most biologically diverse rainforest in the world. First up, we enjoy an informative cruise on the Daintree River before an exclusive guided tour at Cooper Creek Wilderness. Situated directly below Thornton Peak, the epicentre of refugial significance in the Daintree, Cooper Creek is home to pristine old growth rainforest and extraordinary fan palm galleries. Here, we'll take a guided tour along the forest floor with expert, inhabitant guides; an exclusive experience that's far removed from other mass tourism offerings in the area.

Late this afternoon we arrive at the Heritage Lodge and Spa for our overnight stay. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Cape Tribulation – Bloomfield Track – Cooktown



This morning we continue our journey through the Daintree to Cape Tribulation, a headland named by Lieutenant James Cook after his ship struck the Great Barrier Reef in 1770. After a stroll along the beach we continue north and tackle the infamous Bloomfield Track. Impassable during the Wet Season, the track passes through some wild country and should only be tackled by 4WD vehicles. There are numerous steep climbs through the rainforest and several creek crossings to negotiate, so sit back and enjoy the scenery as your experienced tour driver does the hard

Once we're across the Bloomfield River we'll visit Bloomfield Falls before lunch at the Lion's Den Hotel, one of QLD's oldest bush pubs. We then depart for Cooktown, where Lieutenant Cook beached the Endeavour for repairs after hitting the reef. Upon our arrival we'll enjoy a town tour including Grassy Hill lookout, the James Cook Museum and Cooktown Botanic Gardens. We then check in to the 4-star Sovereign Resort Hotel for our overnight stay. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4 Cooktown – Lakefield National Park



Today we depart Cooktown along the Battle Camp Road and visit the Old Laura Homestead before arriving into Laura.

This morning we visit art sites in the Laura area, where an experienced Aboriginal guide will accompany us to interpret the art and explain the significance

This area is famous for its rock art.

Later on, we enjoy lunch and a visit to the Quinkan Cultural Centre. We then travel through the grassy plains and woodlands of Rinyirru (Lakefield) National Park, tackling several creek crossings along the way.

We'll stop at Kalpowar on the Normanby River for afternoon tea, followed by a visit to Red Lily Lagoon, home to a vast array of flora and fauna. Admire the tall lotus lily with its spectacular pink flowers and dense yellow stamens and keep an eye out for Brolgas and Sarus cranes striding through the lilies searching for sedge tubers.

This afternoon we pass through Nifold Plain, an open savannah characterised by thousands of magnetic termite mounds. We then continue through to Lotus Bird Lodge, beautifully located on the edge of a tranquil billabong. Enjoy an exclusive two night stay to discover the area. *Meals: B.L.D*

Today enjoy a breath-taking helicopter flight over Rinyirru (Lakefield). Board our exclusively chartered Bell Jet Ranger and fly over swamps, plains and forests before following the Kennedy River to Princess Charlotte Bay. You'll spot crocodiles, pigs, cattle and all sorts of other wildlife on this mesmerising flight. It really is the only way to get a true appreciation of the area and adds a great perspective of Cape York Peninsula.

Day 7 Wildlife Cruise - Batavia Downs -**Moreton Telegraph Station**

This morning we join Western Cape Eco Tours for a cruise on the Embley River. Explore diverse wildlife habitat, learn about local culture and keep an eye out for some big salt water crocodiles! Our skipper will also provide a detailed insight into Weipa's bauxite mining industry. Afterwards, we'll visit the Western Cape Cultural Centre which showcases the history of Weipa and its surrounding communities. The centre enjoys an enviable location overlooking the bay, so it's a great place for a picnic lunch.

This afternoon we depart Weipa and make our way towards Moreton Telegraph Station. We'll pass Batavia Downs before heading north along the Telegraph Track, arriving at Moreton mid-afternoon. Situated on the banks of the Wenlock River, Moreton served as a repeater station for the Overland Telegraph Line established in the 1880's. The last Morse telegram code was sent from Brisbane to Thursday Island on the 24th June 1964, yet the line remained in use until 1987 as the local telephone line.

Day 8 Piccaninny Plains Wildlife Sanctuary



This morning we head south down the Telegraph Track to Piccaninny Plains, a wildlife sanctuary jointly owned by Australian Wildlife Conservancy (AWC) & the Tony and Lisette Lewis Foundation -WildlifeLink. The sanctuary covers 420,000 acres of stunning ecological diversity, decorated by a mosaic of rainforests, woodlands & wetlands.

Cape York was connected to New Guinea for much of the last 250,000 years. The repeated interchange of flora and fauna has bequeathed a rich biological legacy on the Peninsula, and Piccaninny Plains captures a superb representation of this evolutionary blend. Its woodlands are distinctly Australian, dominated by antipodean species such as eucalypts, acacias and kangaroos. In contrast, the rainforests that thread their way across the property have a strong New Guinean

flavour, supporting charismatic species like the Spotted Cuscus. The juxtaposition of Australian & New Guinean wildlife explains why Piccaninny Plains supports such a high number of species, including 257 species of birds. In Australia, many of these animals are only found on Cape York Peninsula, including the Yellow-billed Kingfisher, Eclectus Parrot, Trumpet Manucode and Magnificent Riflebird.

AWC is responsible for delivering land management and science programs across Piccaninny, and this morning we'll chat to some of the sanctuary's managers to get an insight into how AWC is securing the future for Cape York wildlife. We then return to Moreton for lunch, followed by a free afternoon. Alternatively, join our guides for an interpretive walk along the Wenlock River, which contains the highest diversity of freshwater fish of all Australian rivers. Species include the Freshwater Sawfish, Speartooth Shark, and more common fish like the Sooty Grunter and Barramundi. Meals: B.L.D

Day 9 Telegraph Track - Heathlands -Fruit Bat Falls - Bamaga



Today our journey continues north along the Telegraph Track, which passes through some wild and rugged countryside. However, as some sections of the track are impassable we'll mainly be travelling on the northern and southern bypass roads on our journey north from Moreton.

This afternoon enjoy a visit to Fruit Bat Falls for a swim in the crystal-clear waters of Eliot Creek, followed by a picnic lunch. We then continue north and cross the Jardine River by vehicular ferry, arriving at Bamaga late afternoon. Enjoy the next two nights in spacious cabins with ensuite bathrooms at Cape York Peninsula Lodge, the perfect base from which to explore 'the tip'. Meals: B.L.D

Day 10 Bamaga - The Tip of Cape York



Today we venture to the northernmost point on the Australian Mainland, a Cape traveller's ultimate destination. The walking track commences at Pajinka and requires a good level of fitness, but is well worth the effort! Get your picture taken next to the iconic signpost and soak up the views of the Torres Strait as your guide fills you in on the history of the area.

Day 11 Endeavour Strait - Thursday Island



This morning we head to Seisia and board the ferry for our cruise across Endeavour Strait. Enjoy informative commentary about the Torres Strait Islands from the captain as we make our way to Thursday Island, situated 35km northwest of the tip of Cape York. The island has a population of approximately 3000 people and is the main administrative centre of the Torres Strait. Upon our arrival we'll enjoy a tour with a local expert overnight at the Jardine Motel. Meals: B.L.D

Day 12 Horn Island - Cairns



This morning we catch a ferry across to Horn Island and enjoy a tour of this once prominent WWII air base. After lunch we visit the Torres Strait Heritage Museum before boarding our Qantas flight back to Cairns. For our final evening together, we'll check in to the the luxurious Shangri-La Hotel located on the Marina, and enjoy a special farewell dinner to reflect upon our incredible adventure to the tip of Australia. Meals: B.L.D



Ludwig Leichhardt

1813 - 1848

Ludwig Leichhardt was born in Prussia in 1813. After studying natural sciences in Germany and England he arrived in Sydney in 1842, where he pursued his interest in botany.

Initially Leichhardt went to the Hunter Valley to study the geology, flora and fauna of the region and to observe farming methods. He also set off alone on a specimen collecting journey from Newcastle to Moreton Bay, Queensland.

In 1844, Leichhardt had hoped to join an overland expedition from Sydney to the newly established Victoria Settlement at Port Essington. After Governor Gipps refused to sanction the venture, Leichhardt himself decided to lead an expedition of volunteers with the aid of private subscriptions.

Ten men left Jimbour, the farthest outpost of settlement on the Darling Downs, on the 1st October 1844. The party crossed vast areas of previously unexplored territory and skirted the shores of the Gulf of Carpentaria, and at one point were given up for dead. When seven men staggered into Port Essington 14 ½ months later, it was somewhat of a national sensation.

Leichhardt's next expedition from Moreton Bay to Perth would sadly be his last. The party simply vanished without a trace. Over the next 90 years countless expeditions were mounted to solve the mystery of Leichhardt and his men. To this day it remains just that: a mystery.

In the mid-1800's, when settlers took up land for grazing in Queensland's vast and arid outback, the role of mounted stockmen and drovers took on great importance. The Australian Stockman's Hall of Fame in Longreach pays tribute to the legendary men and women who helped shape Australia's pastoral legacy.

The vast distances of remote Queensland gave birth to Qantas, our revered national carrier, over 100 years ago, making it one of the oldest airlines in the world. Thanks to Reverend John Flynn, it's also the birthplace of the Royal Flying Doctor Service, which took to the skies with its first patient in 1927.

The Savannah Way stretches all the way across the top of Australia, from Cairns in the east to Broome on the west coast. Whilst many have travelled the western half, few have journeyed across the Gulf of Carpentaria through the wilds of Western Queensland and the Northern Territory. It's more rugged and more remote, and a spectacular addition to your outback itinerary.

Your journey

Day 1 Your Adventure Begins in Cairns

Upon your arrival at Cairns airport today, you will be met by your friendly and professional Tour Driver and Tour Director. We'll then check in to the Shangri-La Hotel located on the Marina, just minutes from the esplanade. Tonight, enjoy a welcome dinner and meet your fellow adventurers. *Meals:* D

Day 2 Atherton Tablelands – Undara Volcanic National Park



Departing Cairns early, we trek west and drive through the scenic Atherton Tablelands. Visit beautiful Millaa Millaa Falls before continuing to Undara Volcanic National Park, which protects the longest lava tube cave system in the world.

Today a local Savannah Guide will take us on a tour through the lava tube cave system. Created when the Undara Volcano erupted over 190,000 years ago, the lava that flowed was enough to fill Sydney Harbour 3 times over. The flows lasted a long time, allowing the outer edge to cool while the interior kept flowing, creating the tubes seen today.

This afternoon we arrive at Undara Experience and check in to our unique accommodation, consisting of restored railway carriages.

The lodge has recently been fully renovated and upgraded, with all rooms now featuring private ensuite bathrooms. Tonight, enjoy dinner in the outdoor style restaurant as the outback sunset fades into a clear starlit night. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Undara – Karumba



This morning we depart Undara and head west to Croydon passing by Blackbull and travel through to Normanton before heading into Karumba.

From here we head back to Karumba to discover the amazing secrets of the mighty barramundi at The Les Wilson Barramundi Discovery Centre, the only hatchery in the world to breed the Southern Gulf strain of this iconic fish!

This brand new interactive and state-of-the-art Interpretive Centre provides the history, stories, lifecycle, and habits of these sought-after fish. On completion enjoy our second night at the End of the Road Motel. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 5 Karumba – Camp 119 – Leichhardt Falls – Hells Gate

Today we follow the Savannah Way across the Gulf. Stop at Camp 119, the most northerly camp of the Burke and Wills Expedition of 1860/61. The exhausted party of Robert O'Hara Burke and William John Wills set up camp close to the seasonal Little Blynoe River, in the hinterland of the Gulf of Carpentaria, in their attempt to cross Australia from south to north. It was the northernmost point of their ill-fated expedition. From here we head to Leichhardt Falls (no swimming).

After lunch we'll make our way north and re-connect with the Savannah Way via Doomadgee. From here we head towards the Northern Territory border, arriving at Hell's Gate Roadhouse late afternoon. Tonight, we stay in new and modern accommodation with ensuite bathrooms. *Meals: B.L.D*

NOTE: Due to the closure of Adel's Grove we will be spending the night at Hell's Gate Roadhouse.

Day 6 Hell's Gate – Pungalina



This morning we enjoy a tour of the station at Hell's Gate. Located on Cliffdale Station, Hell's Gate takes its name from a gap in the escarpment one kilometre south. After lunch on the station, we continue along the Savannah Way and cross the border into the Northern Territory.


Not far into the Territory we turn off and head north into Australian Wildlife Conservancy's Pungalina-Seven Emu Wildlife Sanctuary and check in to our safari camp. Built by Outback Spirit in 2019, the camp features unique safari tents with ensuite bathrooms and covered decks, the perfect spot for a three-night stay to discover the area.

Together the two properties cover a combined area of around 305,000 hectares and include coastal monsoon rainforest, tall paper bark forests, palm fringed wetlands, deep gorges, and coastal flood plains. The sanctuary is home to over 40 species of mammals, 190 species of birds and 95 species of frogs and reptiles.

Over the next two days, we'll explore Pungalina-Seven Emu Sanctuary and learn about what makes these two properties such important ecological habitats in northern Australia. Activities include a scenic helicopter flight over the sanctuary, following the spectacular Calvert River all the way to the shores of the Gulf of Carpentaria. Take a cruise on the Calvert River and experience some rarely seen but truly spectacular scenery. We'll also enjoy an informative ecology tour with trained AWC staff.

In between activities you'll have the opportunity for a dip in the beautiful thermal creek that runs past the safari camp. Its waters run at a constant 32 degrees, making it a perfect place to relax and soak up the pristine environment. *Meals: B.L.D*

Savannah Way – Borroloola – Lorella Springs Station



This morning we return to the Savannah Way, also known as the 'Great Top Road'. We make our way west to Borroloola on the McArthur River before passing through Limmen National Park. We arrive at Lorella Springs Station late this afternoon for our two-night stay.

Lorella Springs is a spectacular onemillion-acre cattle station that stretches to the shores of the Gulf. Accommodation here has recently been upgraded and now comprises a mixture of different rooms and cabins, all with private ensuite bathrooms. *Meals: B.L.D*

Days 10 & 11 Exploring Lorella Springs Station



Over the next two days we explore all the wonders of Lorella Springs Wilderness Park. Visit pristine thermal springs, take a helicopter flight over the Southern Lost City, and head all the way to the coast for a walk along the shores of the Gulf – a truly surreal experience that beautifully complements the sunset cruise in Karumba and helicopter flight at Pungalina. At the end of each day's adventures, join your station hosts at the bar for happy hour and mingle with other likeminded explorers journeying across the Gulf. *Meals: B.L.D*



Day 12 Southern Lost City – Roper Bar – Mataranka



Our travels today take us along one of the most remote sections of Savannah Way.
Used extensively by drovers in the 1870's, thousands of cattle have walked this route on their way from Queensland to the Northern Territory and the Kimberley.

We'll pass through the dramatic scenery of the Limmen National Park and take a short, guided walk into the geological wonder of the Southern Lost City from the ground. We then continue north along the Savannah Way towards Roper Bar.

This afternoon we press on to Mataranka, following the Roper Highway arriving late afternoon for our overnight accommodation at the Territory Manor Motel. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 13 Mataranka – Katherine



This morning we enjoy a visit to Mataranka's deep, sandy-bottomed thermal pools for a swim amongst the Livistona palms. There is no better way to start the day!

The landmark Tree of Knowledge, under which the strikers met, stood outside the railway station.

We arrive at Longreach this afternoon and spend the next two nights at Saltbush retreat, a boutique outback lodge. This evening we enjoy a cruise on the Thomson River, followed by dinner on the riverbank. Day 5 Stockman's Hall of Fame – Qantas Founders Museum

Longreach is named after the 'long reach' of the Thomson River on which it is situated. Today we visit the Qantas Founders Museum which houses a Boeing 747 and the airline's first 707. Enjoy a tour inside both aircraft and wander through the exceptional museum before visiting the iconic Stockman's Hall of Fame, opened by Queen Elizabeth II in 1988.


Day 6 Winton - National Heritage Listed Lark Quarry

This morning we depart Longreach and head for Winton, stopping along the way to visit the Australian Age of Dinosaurs Museum. Enjoy a guided tour before arriving into Winton, a town with a rich history and links to the Great Shearer's Strike, Qantas and Waltzing Matilda. This afternoon we visit Lark Quarry Conservation Reserve, containing the world's only record of a dinosaur stampede. We overnight at the Boulder Opal Motor Inn in Winton. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 7 Winton - Mt. Isa

Before leaving town, we enjoy a visit to Winton's Waltzing Matilda Centre. Rebuilt after the devastating 2015 fire, the centre features a world class museum that tells the story of Waltzing Matilda, along with an art gallery and exhibition space. We then continue northwest to Cloncurry, passing by the Walkabout Creek Hotel at McKinlay which featured in the legendary film 'Crocodile Dundee'.

We continue on to Mt. Isa, arriving mid-afternoon. We spend the next two nights at the Red Earth Hotel, a luxurious boutique style hotel in the centre of town. Meals: B.L.D





Day 8 Mt. Isa – Mine Tour – Riversleigh Fossil Centre

Mt. Isa began as a mining town following the discovery of substantial deposits of lead in 1923. It is now one of the world's top 10 producers of copper, silver, lead and zinc. This morning we enjoy a town tour before visiting 'Outback at Isa' home to a vast array of tourism attractions. First, we'll take an underground tour of the Hard Times Mine.

Then visit the unique Riversleigh Fossil Centre which interprets the World Heritage Listed fossil sites at Riversleigh, which we visit tomorrow on the way to Lawn Hill. There's also an art gallery, the 'Isa Experience' exhibit and a fish hatchery project. This afternoon enjoy free time to relax at the hotel or stroll through the CBD of Mt. Isa. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 9 Mt. Isa – Cloncurry

This morning we set our sights east to the outback township of Cloncurry. The Cloncurry River was named after Lady Elizabeth Cloncurry from County Galway in Ireland. It was named by the explorer, Robert O'Hara Burke. Lady Cloncurry was his cousin. When the town was surveyed it took the name of the river.

The first-ever flight of the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia took place from Cloncurry on 15 May 1928, using a de Havilland DH.50 aircraft hired from the then small airline, Qantas.

We visit the John Flynn Museum, which In 1928 Flynn established the Aerial Medical Service in Cloncurry which took his caring service to remote homesteads and communities. The display includes some interesting personal memorabilia and explanations of how the whole Flying Doctor system worked in the early days.

Flynn's story is the triumph of an unceasing commitment against huge odds. The museum also records the remarkable work of Alfred Traeger, the man who invented the push pedal radio. We continue sightseeing before checking into the Gidgee Inn Motel and enjoy some true Aussie outback hospitality. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 10 Cloncurry - Karumba

Our journey today takes us due north along the Burke Development Road towards Normanton with lunch at the Burke & Wills Roadhouse.

For years, the Burke & Wills Roadhouse has become a strategic stop for travellers. Located on Lot 51 Burke Developmental Road Four Ways Queensland, this roadhouse is just halfway between Cloncurry and the Gulf of Carpentaria. Due to the vast remoteness, Burke & Wills Roadhouse becomes an essential stop for locals and travellers to break up any journey or for fuel and food. We learn of the expedition in 1860/61 before heading onto Normanton and into Karumba.

Located on the banks of the Norman River, Karumba came to importance in the 1930's when it became a stop-over point for flying boats on the run from London to Australia. This afternoon we enjoy a special Sand Island sunset dinner cruise in the Gulf. Dine on local seafood while watching a sensational gulf sunset. (Includes wine and beer. Alternative meals are available). We overnight at the End of the Road Motel. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 11 Karumba – Gulflander – Barramundi Centre



Matthew Flinders

1774 - 1814

Born in England in 1774, Flinders joined the Navy at age 15 to become a sailor.

After training as a navigator, he went on to become an outstanding naval officer, surveyor, scientist and explorer. In 1795 he commanded the Norfolk and sailed to Australia to carry out vital coastal survey work. He and George Bass circumnavigated Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania) and were the first Europeans to realise it was separate from mainland Australia.

On returning to England, Flinders was promoted to commander and appointed captain of HMS *Investigator* with instructions to explore the southern coastline of Australia. He reached Western Australia in late 1801 and set about surveying Australia's uncharted coast. His methodical work resulted in precise and detailed charts that saw much of Australia's coastline mapped.

Flinders arrived in Sydney on 9th May 1802, having completed the task given to him by the Admiralty in England. A few months later, he departed once again on an expedition up the eastern coast of New South Wales and Queensland, making detailed surveys of the Queensland coast up to the top of Cape York. He eventually circumnavigated Australia, arriving at Port Jackson on 9th June 1803.

Matthew Flinders passed away on 19th July 1814 in London. Memorials to him can be found throughout South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria, and many coastal features have been named in his honour.

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
CENTRAL AUSTRALIA & CORNER COUNTRY

The heart & soul of the Outback

When people think of the Outback, it's often the centre of the country that comes to mind first. Sunsets over desert plains, vibrant red dirt, towering ghost gums and crisp winter nights. It's an area made for adventure and has played host to some extraordinary expeditions over the years.

In the early 1860's two expedition teams set out to cross the Australian Continent from south to north. Whilst both parties were successful in reaching the northern shoreline, one would end in great tragedy under a Coolibah tree on the bank of Cooper's Creek. Burke and Wills were just 9 hours late from meeting their companions when they stumbled back in to camp LXV, an unbelievably small margin considering they'd been gone for over 4 months. The 'Dig Tree', where supplies were buried for them, still stands to this day. Retracing parts of these legendary expeditions and following in their footsteps makes for a wonderful adventure.

Apart from the fascinating history, the area also offers up some heavy hitting "wow" factors. Uluru, Kings Canyon, Chambers Pillar and the recent phenomenon 'Field of Light' are just some of the sights that await in Central Australia.





Len Beadell

1923 - 1995

Len Beadell is regarded as one of the last true Australian Explorers, responsible for constructing over 6000 kilometres of roads and opening up over 2.5 million square kilometres of the rugged Australian outback. He was a surveyor, road builder and bushman, whose life's work became legendary.

Post World War II, the Australian Government agreed to establish a rocket-launch facility in the outback to assist Great Britain and allied European countries develop intercontinental ballistic missiles. Len Beadell, then a surveyor in the Australian Army, was ordered to find a suitable place to establish this rocket range (Woomera Rocket Range) and develop a network of outback roads across Australia.

The Gunbarrel Road construction party, led by Beadell, worked tirelessly over four years to build the first road that went from west to east through the centre of the continent. The Gunbarrel Highway is a rough desert track that stretches 1,300 kilometres from Carnegie Station in Western Australia to Victory Downs in the Northern Territory. It was named 'Gunbarrel Highway' because Beadell aspired to create roads "as straight as a gun barrel". The working conditions were harsh, and all supplies had to be carried in, but the ambitious project was completed in 1958.

Beadell passed away at the age of 72. His roads have become legend in the Australian bush, just like the man himself.

Your journey

Day 1 Adelaide - Port Augusta

Today you'll be greeted at Adelaide airport upon your arrival (please arrive by 11am). After some lunch we make our way out of Adelaide and head north along the Princes Highway to Port Augusta. We arrive late this afternoon and spend the night at the Standpipe Golf Motor Inn. *Meals: L.D*

Day 2 Port Augusta – Parachilna – Marree

This morning we visit the Aridlands Botanic Gardens and Wadlata Outback Centre, an award winning multifunctional visitor centre. Step back in time and learn about the early explorers of Sturt, Eyre, Giles and Stuart and their brave expeditions into the unknown. We then head up the western side of the Flinders Ranges, arriving at Parachilna early this afternoon for a gourmet lunch under the verandah of the Prairie Hotel.

This afternoon we continue heading north through Leigh Creek to Marree. Located at the junction of the Oodnadatta and Birdsville Tracks, Marree is a true desert settlement which enjoys just 155mm of rainfall annually. We spend the night at the Marree Hotel in cabins with ensuite bathrooms. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Oodnadatta Track - Coober Pedy

This morning we visit the Marree Museum which features the famous old mail truck E.G. Kruse, used to transport mail from Marree to Birdsville. Then, travel the Oodnadatta Track and follow in the footsteps of John McDouall Stuart. Pass by Lake Eyre South and through William Creek before arriving into Coober Pedy mid-afternoon.

Due to the summer heat, most of Coober Pedy's residents live underground. The town is also known as the opal capital of the world, supplying 70% of the world's precious opals. This afternoon enjoy a guided tour of the Umoona Opal Mine and perhaps fossick for your own. Tonight we stay at the award winning Desert Cave Hotel.

Day 4 Coober Pedy - Uluru

Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) - Uluru (Ayers Rock) - Sounds of Silence Dinner



This morning early risers will experience the sun rising over Uluru and the colours of dawn spreading across the landscape. After breakfast, head off to discover Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) and admire the stunning rock formations on a guided walk into Walpa Gorge. Then, return for a guided tour around the base of Uluru, which stands 348 metres above the desert plains. Learn about traditional Anangu culture as you marvel at one of the largest monoliths in the world!

Day 8 Alice Springs Sightseeing

Today we explore 'the Alice'. Our activities include a visit to the award-winning Alice Springs Desert Park, The Royal Flying Doctor Service and a tour of the historic Telegraph Station. We arrive back at the hotel late afternoon.

This evening we head into the East MacDonnell ranges for a unique and authentic dining experience. The 'Original Outback Bush BBQ dinner show' is a fun filled evening of entertainment and Outback cuisine, taking place around a large campfire under a star filled territory sky. Enjoy timeless Australian songs from a bush balladeer and gain some insights from the local cattlemen's talk. The dinner includes a sumptuous 3-course meal and all beverages. Meals: B.L.D

Day 9 East MacDonnell Ranges



Today we travel from Alice Springs and venture further east along the MacDonnell Ranges to see more of these rugged central Australian landscapes. Trephina Gorge Nature Park is our first destination and features a network of short walking trails that let you delve deep into the heart of this magnificent natural setting. Trephina Gorge is known for the exceptionally large eucalyptus trees that line the sandy creek bed, and nearby we can visit the largest ghost gum in Central Australia.

After our time here we make our way to Corroboree Rock Conservation Area. A short walk around the base of the rock reveals some of the geological history of the region. Made up of ancient sediment and fine-grained rock, the structure was formed more than 800 million years ago by salt lakes. While not thought to be a corroboree site, this impressive structure is of great importance to the local Arrernte people and plays a significant role in their culture today.

We arrive back in Alice Springs this afternoon where you can spend the rest of your day at your leisure. Meals: B.L.D

Day 10 **Devils Marbles - Barkly Tablelands**

This morning we depart Alice Springs and trek north again along the Stuart Highway. Visit Karlwe Karlwe (The Devils Marbles), a series of massive granite boulders scattered across a wide, shallow valley. After a picnic lunch we'll continue on to Tennant Creek and visit the Battery Hill Mining Centre. We then head east to the Barkly Homestead, where we spend the night in comfortable motel rooms. Meals: B.L.D

Day 11 Cape Crawford - Lorella Springs

The Barkly Tablelands are well suited to cattle grazing and economically it is one of the most important areas for pastoral production in the NT. The Mitchell and Flinders grasses provide excellent feed on the rich black soils. The largest lease (Brunette Downs) is over 12,000 square kms and runs around 65,000 head of cattle.

This afternoon we pass through Cape Crawford and take the Savannah Way north to Lorella Springs Station. This one-million-acre station sits adjacent to the Limmen National Park and stretches all the way to the shores of the Gulf. Accommodation comprises a mixture of safari tents and cabins, all with ensuite bathrooms. Meals: B.L.D

Day 12 'Lost City' & Thermal Springs



Today we take part in an exhilarating helicopter and ground tour of the southern 'Lost City'. After landing near these ancient sandstone structures, enjoy a ground tour with your guides who'll tell you about the local geology, vegetation and birdlife. We return to Lorella midafternoon, where the rest of the day can be spent at your leisure. Enjoy a dip in the nearby thermal springs, one of the most pristine in the Northern Territory. Meals: B.L.D

Day 13 Savannah Way - Roper Bar - Katherine

erine Gorge, Nitmiluk National Pa

Our travels today take us further north along the Savannah Way. We pass through the remote village of Roper Bar, situated on the south-eastern boundary of Arnhem Land. The Roper River was first explored by Ludwig Leichhardt in 1845 and by the 1870's was lined with paddle steamers bringing in supplies for the men building the Overland Telegraph Line. One paddle steamer, the Young Australian ran aground on a rocky ledge and its ruins are still there to this day.

This afternoon we travel through Mataranka and on to Katherine. We spend the night at Knotts Crossing Resort. Meals: B.L.D

Day 14 Katherine River Gorge Cruise - Darwin



This morning we enjoy a 2-hour boat cruise on Katherine River Gorge in Nitmiluk National Park. We then continue to Darwin, arriving mid-afternoon to check in to the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel which is perfectly positioned along the Darwin Esplanade. Enjoy the rest of the afternoon at your leisure before boarding the Charles Darwin for a delicious Territory style sunset dinner cruise and celebrate a truly amazing trip! Meals: B.L.D

Day 3 Exploring Mungo – Broken Hill



This morning we explore Mungo National Park, which was World Heritage Listed in 1981 in recognition of its rich Aboriginal heritage. Remains of the earliest humans to inhabit the Australian continent have been found in the park and have been dated at more than 60,000 years old. We travel on to Menindee, a town of 1,000 people on the banks of the Darling River.

The town has ties to several Australian explorers, including Burke & Wills, Charles Sturt & Major Mitchell. This afternoon we arrive into Broken Hill and check in to the Royal Exchange Hotel. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4 Exploring Broken Hill

After breakfast this morning we visit the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) visitor centre, which also acts as a working RFDS base. Enjoy a tour of the base and learn about one of the largest and most comprehensive aeromedical organisations in the world.

Enjoy the rest of the day exploring Broken Hill, first up is a visit to Silverton, location of countless films including Mad Max II, Mission Impossible II and the Adventures of Priscilla, Queen of the Desert. Then, visit the Albert Kersten Mining and Minerals Museum for an insight into Broken Hill's unique Geology. We'll also visit the Sulphide Street Railway & Historical, Lode Miners Memorial and later on, the Living Desert Reserve and Sculpture Symposium. Meals: B.L.D

Day 5 Milparinka – Tibooburra

Today we head north to the historic town of Milparinka, and then west on to Depot Glen, named by Captain Charles Sturt on his 1845 expedition to find an inland sea. This afternoon we arrive at the small outback village of Tibooburra for our overnight stay. *Meals: B.L.D*

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Day 6 Cameron Corner - Innamincka



This morning we venture into the vast Sturt National Park en route to Cameron Corner. where OLD. NSW and SA all meet. This area was first surveyed by James Cameron from the NSW Lands Department in 1879.

It's also home to the longest fence in the world, The Dog Fence, stretching from the Great Australian Bight to Jimbour near Brisbane (5,600km).

After lunch at the Corner Store, we continue heading west onto the village of Innamincka, set on the banks of Cooper's Creek. We spend the next two nights at the Innamincka Hotel. Meals: B.L.D

Day 7 Innamincka Sightseeing - Cooper's **Creek Cruise**



Innamincka once played a major role in early explorations of Australia's unknown interior. With its reliable water source, it made an ideal resting place for expeditions and cattle drives from the east and the south.

This morning we cross the border into QLD to visit the 'Dig Tree'. This is where explorers Burke and Wills returned to after their expedition to the Gulf of Carpentaria, only to discover their party had left just 9 hours earlier

After lunch we embark on a cruise of Cooper's Creek. Enjoy expert commentary and learn about this incredibly unique river system - one of the last unregulated systems in the world. This afternoon we return to the hotel for our final night in Innamincka. Meals: B.L.D

Day 8 Strzelecki Desert - Birdsville Track - Mungerannie

This morning we make our way west through the oil and gas fields around Moomba. Cross Cooper's Creek at Walkers Crossing before joining up with the Birdsville Track. We then head south to the small village of Mungerannie, where we spend the night. Meals: B.L.D

Day 9

Kalamurina Wildlife Sanctuary - Birdsville





This morning we venture out to Kalamurina Wildlife Sanctuary, owned and operated by Australian Wildlife Conservancy. Kalamurina is a vast desert wilderness, stretching from the northern shore of Kati Thanda - Lake Eyre to the southern boundary of the Simpson Desert reserves.



Enjoy a briefing about Kalamurina conservation projects and it's haven status for several endangered species, such as the Dusky Hopping Mouse and Lake Eyre Dragon.

Next we head north up the Birdsville Track and arrive at the Birdsville Hotel late afternoon. Enjoy two nights here in quality accommodation with friendly outback hospitality. Meals: B.L.D

Day 10 "Big Red" (Simpson Desert)



This morning we'll have a look around Birdsville and visit the Wirrarri Visitor Centre. Birdsville was originally named Diamantina Crossing in 1881 after the Diamantina River, which runs to the east of the town. However, the township was renamed Birdsville in 1885 by the owner of Pandie Pandie Station, who was amazed by the diversity of birdlife which inhabited the area.

Birdsville is also situated on the edge of the Simpson Desert National Park, which is characterised by huge red sand dunes. There are approximately 1,100 dunes running North-South across the Simpson. This afternoon, we visit 'Big Red' (Nappanerica) the Simpsons most famous sand dune before returning for our final night in Birdsville. Meals: B.L.D

Day 11 Bedourie - Boulia

Today we continue north through Queensland's Channel Country to the small township of Bedourie. Bedourie is the main administrative centre for the Diamantina Shire, the second largest shire in Queensland after the Cooktown Shire. After

some lunch we continue to Boulia, known as the capital of the Channel Country.

The area is also known for the mysterious Min Min Light, which has now been sighted for almost half a century.

This afternoon we visit the Min Min Encounter Visitor Centre where we'll enjoy a unique theatrical experience and learn the story of the Min Min Light. We overnight at the Boulia Desert Sands Motel or the Australian Hotel. Meals: B.L.D

Day 12 Boulia - NT Border - Alice Springs

An early start this morning as we make our way west towards the Northern Territory Border. Travel along the Plenty Highway through Harts Range and Gemtree to arrive into Alice Springs late this afternoon.


SOUTH AUSTRALIA

A visual and culinary delight

When Governor John Hindmarsh proclaimed the colony of South Australia at 'The Old Gum Tree' in 1836, it was in more ways than one quite unique. This was Australia's first freely settled state, rather than a convict settlement. Fast forward to today and South Australia is a culturally vibrant state that's renowned for its festivals, fine wines and stunning outback landscapes. It's home to the Flinders Ranges, one of the oldest mountain ranges on Earth featuring rugged mountains and peaceful gorges, with Wilpena Pound as its centrepiece.

In the centre of South Australia you'll find Lake Eyre, Australia's largest salt lake and the 13th largest lake in the world. One sixth of the Australian continent drains into Lake Eyre, and in some cases water from thousands of kilometres away will find its way there. In years of extremely high rainfall in the Channel Country and the Gulf, the rivers of the outback deliver massive volumes of water, creating an 'inland sea' that teems with wildlife. But even in dry conditions Lake Eyre is one of the most spectacular sights in the outback.

Just a stone's throw offshore lies beautiful Kangaroo Island, a sanctuary for Sea Lions and Fur Seals. Along the coastal curves of The Great Australian Bight, you'll see stunning cliff faces that provide the perfect vantage point for spotting giant Southern Right Whales as they undertake their annual migration through the Southern Ocean.





Donald Campbell

1921 - 1967

Donald Campbell was an Englishman born in Surrey, and the son of speed record breaker Sir Malcolm Campbell. He was the first man to break the 400-mile per hour limit in a wheel-driven vehicle at Lake Eyre in South Australia. Reaching 648.7 kilometres per hour, he became the fastest man on the planet and Lake Eyre's salt pans received international recognition.

Inheriting a love of speed from his father who held 13 world speed records on land and water, Campbell became a maintenance engineer at Briggs Motor Bodies Ltd. He volunteered for the RAF at the outbreak of the Second World War but was barred from serving after suffering a bout of rheumatic fever.

When his father died on New Year's Eve in 1948, Campbell with the aid of his father's chief engineer, decided to pursue speed records himself. Initially, he used his father's old boat Bluebird K4 in his recordbreaking attempts and set eight world speed records – seven on water.

In 1960 he survived a horrific crash while trying to break the land speed record but wasn't deterred. On the 4th of January 1967, on his return run at England's Lake Coniston, Campbell's Bluebird K7 boat flipped at an estimated 528 kilometres per hour, killing him instantly. He paid the ultimate price for his love of record breaking and remains the only person to set both world land and water speed records in the same year.

Day 9 Lake Eyre (Kati Thanda) – Kalamurina Wildlife Sanctuary



This morning it's time for our scenic flight over Lake Eyre. Our flight path takes us over Lake Eyre South before crossing over Lake Eyre North, the larger of the two lakes. Fly over Belt Bay and follow the Warburton Groove up the middle of the lake and into the Warburton Creek system. From here we follow the creek to Kalamurina Wildlife Sanctuary, landing late morning.

Kalamurina is a 1.7 million-acre property owned and managed by Australian Wildlife Conservancy. This vast desert wilderness stretches from the northern shores of Kati Thanda – Lake Eyre to the southern boundary of the Simpson Desert and provides a haven for several endangered species like the Dusky Hopping Mouse, Mulgara and Ampurta.

After landing at Kalamurina we head to the banks of the Warburton Creek for a guided tour with one of the sanctuary's managers. Learn about the transformation of this station from cattle country to wildlife haven and gain an insight into AWC's conservation programs. We then travel by coach down the Birdsville Track, crossing Cooper's Creek before arriving back into Marree late this afternoon. *Meals: B.L.D*

Note: Today the tour splits into two groups. The second group will experience the activities in reverse.

Day 10 Oodnadatta Track - William Creek & Painted Hills - Coober Pedy



After breakfast this morning we follow the legendary Oodnadatta Track to the tiny outback settlement of William Creek.

The track itself is steeped in history, natural wonders and rich cultural heritage and is regarded as one of the best outback drives in Australia. It follows a traditional Aboriginal trading route and, because of the availability of water, was chosen for the Central Australian Railway; the original route of the Old Ghan.

This morning we stop off at Coward Springs siding, a fully restored and heritage-listed railway site displaying history and remnants of the 'Old Ghan'. Then continue to William Creek for lunch at the iconic William Creek Hotel before enjoying a special 1-hour scenic flight over the 'Painted Hills'. This rocky outcrop of large and small hills, which emerge suddenly out of a flat desert landscape, can only be accessed by air due to their fragility and natural beauty.

This afternoon we trek on to Coober Pedy and spend the next two nights at the Desert Cave Hotel. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 11 Coober Pedy Sightseeing



Due to the heat in summer, much of Coober Pedy's population live underground. The town is also the opal capital of the world, supplying 70% of the world's precious opals. This morning we enjoy a guided tour of the Umoona Opal Mine, where you're also free to do some fossicking of our own.

In the afternoon, head out to the Breakaways Reserve and admire the colourful low hills separated from the Stuart Range. We then return to the Desert Cave Hotel to explore its many galleries. Meals: B.L.D

Day 12 Woomera – Port Augusta

Travelling south today we head to Woomera, home to the Woomera Range Complex operated by the Royal Australian Air Force. The complex is a major Australian defence and civil aerospace facility that is both a working military airbase and a testing ground for ADF materials. Enjoy a visit to the Woomera Interactive Rocket Range Museum and view historical displays relating to the Woomera Range and closed Joint Defence Facility at Nurrungar.

This afternoon we continue on to Port Augusta where we overnight at the Standpipe Golf Motor Inn. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 13 Port Augusta – Adelaide

After breakfast we visit the Aridlands Botanic Gardens before heading south to the Clare Valley. Well known for its Riesling, the area also produces exceptional Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz varieties which together account for nearly half of all wine from the area. After a tour through the region, we'll visit a local winery for a relaxed lunch and wine tastings, a great way to wind down as we approach the end of the adventure. This afternoon we arrive back into Adelaide and check in to the Stamford Grand Hotel in Glenelg. We enjoy our final dinner together at the hotel. *Meals: B.L.D*

Your journey

Day 1 Adelaide - Clare Valley

This morning you will be greeted by our friendly Tour Director and Tour Driver upon your arrival at the Adelaide Airport. (Arrive by 11:00am, alternative pick up in Adelaide City available). This afternoon we depart Adelaide and head north to the Clare Valley, one of South Australia's most prosperous wine regions. We overnight here at the Clare Country Club. *Meals: L.D*

Day 2 Clare Valley – Port Augusta



This morning we explore the secluded Clare Valley beginning with a tour of Bungaree Station, a historic complex dating back to 1841. Bungaree was once an extensive sheep station that carried over 100,000 Merino sheep, and today is still run by descendants of the original founders. Later this morning we'll visit a renowned Clare Valley winery for lunch and wine tastings. We then continue our journey north, arriving in Port Augusta later this afternoon. We spend the night at the Standpipe Golf Motor Inn. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Whyalla – Port Lincoln

This morning we travel down the eastern side of the Eyre Peninsula. Our first stop is Whyalla, where we'll visit the excellent Whyalla Maritime Museum. Then, continue heading south through Cowell and Tumby Bay before arriving at the seaside town of Port Lincoln late afternoon. We check in to the Port Lincoln Hotel for our stay over the next three nights. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4 Exploring Port Lincoln



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This morning we journey to the foot of the Eyre Peninsula and travel along Whaler's Way, a 14km long series of unsealed tracks which traverse through private property. This fully guided interpretive tour takes in the spectacular rugged coastal scenery of the area, with many points of interest and stunning views over the Southern Ocean.

After lunch, we join a two hour Seafood Bay Cruise for some sightseeing across the beautiful waters of Boston Bay. The cruise includes fresh seafood tastings of tuna, prawns and mussels along with informative commentary about the local fishing/aquaculture industries presented by experienced guides. We arrive back at our hotel later this afternoon for our second night in Australia's Seafood Capital. Meals: B.L.D

Day 5 Interpretive Marina & Seafood Lovers tour



This morning we'll enjoy an interpretive walking tour around the Port Lincoln Marina with a local guide. Bunda Cliffs and Head of Bight



This morning we have an early breakfast and depart Ceduna for the Head of Bight. Every year, thousands of people visit the Head of Bight area for breathtaking views of migrating southern right whales. This area is considered one of the best viewing areas in the world with up to 100 whales congregating in the seas adjacent to the Bunda Cliffs at any one time. A large viewing platform offers people safety from the cliffs but also fantastic views.

This afternoon we visit an interpretive centre operated by the Conservation and Land Management Department. Then we head off on an included Scenic Flight over the spectacular coastline, keeping an eye out for migrating whales. Our aircraft for the day is a Cessna Grand Caravan, with high wing, air-conditioning and turbine reliability. The scenic flight will take us all the way back to Ceduna, saving a long drive back from Head of Bight! Tonight we enjoy our final evening together at the Foreshore Hotel. Meals: B.L.D

Note: Today the tour will split into two groups, with a morning flight & afternoon flight. One group will drive out to Head of Bight and fly back, and the other will fly out to Head of Bight and drive back.

Day 8 Ceduna - Adelaide



This morning we say farewell to the Eyre Peninsula and head to the local airport. Included in your tour fare is a one-way flight from Ceduna to Adelaide with Regional Express. Jane Franklin

1791 - 1875

Born in England in 1791, Jane Franklin was a woman who broke tradition and sought a life of exploration during an age when women of her class were tending to needlework and domestic duties. In her late twenties she accompanied her husband, Arctic explorer John Franklin to Van Diemen's Land, where he was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the colony.

As one of the earliest women in Tasmania to have experienced the benefit of education and cultural surroundings, Lady Franklin was an example of a new way of living. She became known for her philanthropic work and travels throughout south-east Australia. On the mainland, she became the first European woman to travel overland between Port Phillip and Sydney in 1839, a journey which was considered incredibly arduous.

Before returning to England at the end of her husband's tenure, she founded a museum and a scientific society that became the first Royal Society for the advancement of science outside of Britain. She also fought for more humane treatment of convicts and became a champion of the arts and women's education.

When her husband disappeared on an expedition in 1845, Lady Franklin dedicated years to financing further expeditions to determine his fate. Lady Franklin was awarded the Royal Geographical Society Founder's Gold Medal in 1860 and her name is remembered at Jane Franklin Hall – a residential college in Hobart, Tasmania.


Day 5 Woolnorth - Cradle Mountain

Smithton is home to Tasmania's most fertile dairy and vegetable growing area. It's also home to the historic Woolnorth Station, which is still owned by the Van Diemen's Land Company. This morning we enjoy a fully guided tour of Woolnorth, including the Roaring 40's Wind Farm and rugged Cape Grim. We then journey south to the World Heritage Listed Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park, where we spend the next two nights at Peppers Cradle Mountain Lodge. Meals: B.L.D



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


Day 6 **Cradle Mountain Exploring**



Today we begin with the 'Enchanted Walk', an easy 45-minute stroll amongst the area's unique alpine flora and fauna. Afterwards we then visit Waldheim Chalet, a replica of the original built by Gustav and Kate Weindorfer in 1912. The original chalet was still used as a guest lodge up until 1974, at which point it was deemed structurally unsound. The replica was built in 1976 using the same local materials.

Later on we make our way up to the stunning glacial-formed Dove Lake. Enjoy dramatic views of Cradle Mountain in the distance, the rugged jewel in the crown of this World Heritage Listed area. For the energetic, a 5.7 kilometre walk will take you around the lake and beneath the towering spires of Cradle Mountain. The track is a boardwalk for much of the way and is regarded as one of Tasmania's premier walks. Your guides will accompany you for the trek, which also passes through a magnificent cool temperate rainforest known as the Ballroom forest. If you don't feel up to taking part in the walk, you'll be transferred back down to the Lodge where you can relax or enjoy the various short walks nearby.



This afternoon we'll sample some of Tasmania's fine wines and cheeses at the Lodge. Meals: B.L.D

Day 7 Cradle Mountain - Strahan

After breakfast we depart Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park and head south. Visit Queenstown and learn about the area's mining history with a local guide before continuing to Strahan. We spend the next two nights at the Strahan Village Motel, set on a hilltop with commanding views over Macquarie Harbour. Meals: B.L.D

Day 8 **Gordon River Cruise**

Departing Strahan early this morning we head through the scenic Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park to Lake St Clair, carved by glaciers during the last Ice Age. Then, discover the 'Wall in the Wilderness' at Derwent Bridge, an exquisite work in progress by artist Greg Duncan. The carved timber panels tell the history of the Central Highlands region, beginning with the Indigenous people, then to the pioneering timber harvesters, pastoralists, miners and hydro workers. It is truly one of Tasmania's best attractions!

After lunch we'll continue heading south east towards Hobart, stopping off at the beautiful Russell Falls along the way. We arrive in Hobart late this afternoon and spend the next three nights at the Hotel Grand Chancellor, located on the waterfront overlooking Constitution Dock. Enjoy premium harbour view rooms. Meals: B.L.D



Australia's most unique expedition vehicles

The Incredible Mercedes-Benz G-Wagon

The Mercedes-Benz G-Wagon is one of the most capable and robust all-terrain vehicles in the world. With over 200,000 units sold since 1979, it is the longest produced Mercedes-Benz in history.

•••••

There are a number of variants of the G-Wagon. The G 'Professional' version is the toughest model with an enhanced drivetrain and suspension. In fact, the Australian Defence Force (ADF) has upgraded its ageing Land Rover fleet with approximately 2,500 of these vehicles.

After vehicle trials with several other makes and models, it became clear that the only vehicle that could meet the demands of this unique expedition was the G-Wagon. Off-road, they are simply unmatched. Comfort-wise, nothing comes close. And then there's the engineering and safety for which Mercedes-Benz is renowned.

Like the ADF we have a fleet that consists of both 6×6 and 4×4 vehicles. The 6×6 underpins the whole expedition thanks to its high payload and remarkable capability. This allows us to carry our own kitchen and amenities units, both of which were custom made and engineered for Outback Spirit.

The amenities unit features two shower/ toilet cubicles and retains all toilet waste for disposal in town.

For a trip like this, the ability to have a hot shower and flushing toilet makes all the difference.

Outback Spirit operates two separate yet identical convoys for this expedition. Each consists of three 6×6 vehicles and two 4×4's. All passenger seats are full size coach seats with seat belts, and all face forward (seat rotations occur daily). They feature good legroom (far more than normal 4WD vehicles), great visibility and are very comfortable. Vehicles are also equipped with satellite telephones and advanced medical kits.

Outback Spirit's investment in this fleet of Mercedes-Benz G-Wagons is over \$4 million. They are the most expensive commercial expedition fleet in Australian travel history, with an average per seat capital cost of over \$100,000. When it comes to our passengers' comfort and safety, no expense is spared.









Camp in comfort

Enjoy the convenience of proper amenities for the whole adventure, including hot showers and flushing toilets

The idea of going without basic comforts is enough to turn anyone off heading bush. Digging holes or hooking up a cumbersome hot water apparatus is no-one's idea of a good time. This is why our desert safaris are so unique.

Aboard each of our six-wheel drive military style G-Wagons is a specially designed and engineered pod. One vehicle houses a mobile kitchen, whilst the other features two equal size bathrooms, complete with hot showers and flushing toilets. A work of art, this incredible amenity unit features a hydraulically raiseable roof, large water storage and return effluent tank. So, in addition to providing that all-important level of comfort, we're also looking after the environment by removing waste instead of burying it in the scrub.

In each Desert Safari crew there's an experienced camp cook who'll provide delicious cuisine for the expedition. And, with ample refrigeration and a re-supply rendezvous (on the Canning), we're never short of good quality, fresh food.

Of course a good night's rest is just as important as a shower and a good meal, so we've provided the best camping equipment available to make the experience as enjoyable as possible.

The large tents are easy to erect with only one centre pole and a few pegs. You'll be sleeping off the ground on sturdy lightweight stretcher beds, with a self-inflating mattress to go on top. As the desert nights can get quite cold, we also provide you with a high quality sleeping bag to keep you warm and comfortable.



Alfred Wernam Canning

1860 - 1936

Alfred Canning joined the NSW Lands Department and served in Bega, Cooma and Bathurst before heading west in 1893. Now with the Western Australian Lands Department, Canning soon proved himself a first-class bushman and reliable surveyor.

One of Canning's first major jobs was to survey a route for a rabbit proof fence, needed to halt the rabbit invasion from the east. The survey alone took nearly 3 years, and on one occasion Canning had to walk over 300 kilometres after his camel died. When completed in 1907, it was the longest line of unbroken fence in the world.

Canning's greatest legacy though was the establishment of a stock route from the East Kimberley to the southern goldfields of Western Australia. Not deterred by the experiences of those who went before him, Canning had the route completed with 51 wells by 1910, an incredible feat.

After a Royal Commission into beef prices in 1928, Canning was asked to repair and recommission the wells. His subordinates on the job recall how he walked the entire route, twice. He was aged 70.

Four deserts, 1800km, 51 wells. An extraordinary adventure like no other

The Canning Stock Route is an extraordinary journey that passes through some of the most remote and isolated country in the world. In certain parts the stock route is incredibly beautiful, with freshwater springs creating astonishing oases in the middle of nowhere. Other areas are home to narrow gorges, sheer cliffs, ancient Aboriginal art sites and engravings of explorers and drovers.

In terms of an outback 4WD adventure, it doesn't get more epic than the CSR. However, heading off into the sunset without the right preparations or experience can be disastrous. The rugged terrain and sheer isolation of the stock route demand an unparalleled level of planning, expertise and competency.

A fascinating tale of bravery and determination


At the beginning of the 20th century, pastoralists from the East Kimberley were looking for a way to traverse the western deserts of Australia with their cattle. Their aim was to break the monopoly enjoyed by their counterparts in the West Kimberley, which effectively controlled the supply of beef to Perth and the southern goldfields of Western Australia. At the time, cattle from the East Kimberley were infested with Boophilus ticks, and these ticks were infected with a malaria-like parasitic disease called Babesiosis. It was feared these ticks would survive the sea journey down to Perth and then spread through southern herds. This gave West Kimberley cattlemen their monopoly and resulted in sky high prices for beef.

In 1905, an East Kimberley pastoralist by the name of James Isdell put forward a proposal for The Canning Stock Route. The route, which crossed the territories of nine different Aboriginal language groups, had been explored previously in 1896 by the Calvert and Carnegie Expeditions but was declared an unviable proposition.

However, with support from pastoralists and the government eager to lower beef prices, the proposal was taken seriously.

Isdell made the case that the ticks wouldn't survive the journey down the long, dry stock route. He finally won the argument, and in 1906 the government appointed Alfred Canning to survey the route. With a team of 23 camels, two horses and eight men, Canning surveyed the route in less than six months. He needed to find significant water sources along the way; enough for up to 800 head of cattle at a time and no further than a day's walk apart. With the survey complete, Canning returned with a construction party and built 51 wells along the route in a little over two years.

Commercial droving along the Canning Stock Route began in 1910, but didn't prove popular. A 1928 Royal Commission into beef prices led to renewed interest, but in total there were only 37 recorded drives. The last was in 1959.

Day 1 Meet in Broome

Day 2 The Adventure Begins

This morning we depart Broome for the adventure of a lifetime. Follow the Great Northern Highway to Fitzroy Crossing before continuing to our first campsite near Halls Creek. Your crew will help you become familiar with the camping equipment* and prepare a sumptuous dinner under the stars. Meals: B.L.D

*Guests are required to put up & take down their own tent (one centre pole and pegs).

Day 3 Billiluna – Crystal Well – Canning's 303 marker

Anticipation grows today as we travel down the Tanami Road and reach the official start of the Canning Stock Route at Billiluna. From here we pass Bloodwood bore, Well 51 and Well 49 – known as the 'Crystal Well' because of its reliable drinking water. Our first night on the stock route will be nearby at Canning's 303 Marker. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4 Godfrey Tank & Breaden Pool



Our destinations today were named after two members of David Carnegie's expedition of 1896. As the party desperately searched for water, Godfrey Massie found a huge natural stone catchment, hence the name 'Godfrey Tank'. Another party member, Joe Breaden, also found water in a lower area which was named Breaden Pool. Today we'll explore the wonderful natural features of these waterholes before continuing our journey south. Briefly stop at Wells 48 and 47 before tackling the first of the big sand dunes. Tonight, we camp at Well 46. Meals: B.L.D

Day 5

Well 45 - The Great Sandy Desert - Gravity Lakes

Today we tackle the Great Sandy Desert and head to an area known as Gravity Lakes. We'll make brief stops at a couple of wells, spending longer at Well 43 – traditionally known as Billowaggi. A drive over the Guli Lake System takes us to our camping spot just north of the Helena Springs Track. Make camp amongst the gum trees and enjoy another magnificent evening under the desert stars. *Meals: B.L.D*

- Gain an insight into the unique and ancient cultures of the Western Desert people who have occupied this remote area for over 30,000 years
- Travel through the traditional lands of the Martu people and view ancient Western Desert rock art

Day 6 Tiru – Tobin Lake – Wardabunni

Our first stop this morning is at Well 41, also called 'Tiru' by traditional owners. The area surrounding 'Tiru' has better than average soil which in turn provided good feed for the mobs of cattle that were driven down the track. Well 40 has some fascinating history regarding a fellow called Michael Tobin, who was part of the original 1906 survey expedition.

After some morning tea we trek across Lake Tobin to arrive at Well 39, home to hundreds of budgerigars that thrive on the surface water provided by the well, now in ruins. We then arrive at Wardabunni Rockhole, the location of Well 38 which was created when members of Canning's party blasted a hole in the rocky creek bed. Water was abundant but it proved difficult to persuade cattle to drink at the site. Nevertheless, it makes for a lovely campsite. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 7 The Mystery of Well 37 – Kunawarritji

After packing up camp our first stop is Well 37, a place shrouded in mystery since the first cattle drive down the stock route in 1910. About 150 bullocks were being driven by George Shoesmith, James Thompson, Fred Terone and an Indigenous stockman called 'Chinaman'. After Fred Terone headed back to Halls Creek due to illness, the remaining men pushed on to Well 37 where they were later found dead under mysterious circumstances. Their graves have been preserved near the well.

After morning tea, we continue south to Well 36 where you'll learn about Eileen and George Lanagan. We then press on and make camp at Well 33 on the outskirts of Kunawarritji Aboriginal Community, one of the most remote communities in Australia. Well 33 has a large water tank and windmill providing plenty of fresh water, so it's a good spot to catch up on some washing. This afternoon we also meet our resupply plane at the airstrip. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 8
Wells 32, 31 & 30 - Thring Rock



This morning we stock up on diesel from the community store and continue our adventure south to Wells 32 (Mallowa), 31 (Wullowla) and 30 (Duna Jinnda). Enjoy lunch under the shady trees surrounding Well 30 before trekking on to Thring Rock, named by Larry Wells in 1896 after a member of John McDouall Stuart's 1862 expedition across Australia. Thring Rock is an impressive sandstone outcrop, and a short climb to the lookout provides exceptional views of the surrounding countryside. Tonight, we camp at the base of Thring Rock. Meals: B.L.D



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Day 9 The Beautiful Desert Oaks

After breakfast we pack up camp and traverse numerous sand dunes en route to Well 27. Enjoy a short morning tea break before continuing to Well 26, recently restored to provide excellent drinking water. After replenishing the convoy's water tanks, we push on to Well 25 for lunch under the shade of some beautiful Desert Oak trees. This afternoon we arrive at Well 24, located just past the intersection of the Talawana Track. Set up camp and get ready for a superb sunset. Meals: B.L.D

Georgia Bore - Lake Disappointment



Today's section of the route is also part of the Talawana Track, which if followed west for 450kms will take you to Newman. We'll pass by the Capricorn Roadhouse fuel dump, where many travellers pre-arrange a 'fuel drop' through the Capricorn Roadhouse.

Fuel is carted out in 44-gallon drums with names written on top, but with the availability of fuel at Kunawarritii the practice has become less popular.

This morning we make a stop at Georgia Bore, which is not a traditional Canning well but a bore drilled by CRA for use by their survey crews in the 1970's. We then trek on towards Lake Disappointment, an ephemeral salt-lake named by Frank Hann in 1897. After following the direction of several creek beds, Hann was expecting to find a large freshwater lake. He instead came across a large dry salt-lake, hence the name 'Lake Disappointment'.

This afternoon we set up camp on the banks of Lake Disappointment and watch the spectacular panorama come alive as the sun sets. Meals: B.L.D

Tropic of Capricorn - Durba Springs

After breaking camp this morning we follow the western edge of Lake Disappointment to Savory Creek.

Depending on recent rainfall, we may need to travel further west to avoid the muddy creek bed. We'll pass by Well 19 and Onegunyah Rockhole before arriving at one of the most scenic parts of the entire stock route, Durba Springs (Jilikuru). We'll camp here for two nights to get the most out of this truly magnificent setting. Meals: B.L.D

Day 12 **Durba Springs**



Durba Springs was always a popular spot for drovers to rest up for a few days while driving cattle down from the East Kimberley. The area, traditionally called 'Jilikuru' by the Martu people, is also home to a number of distinctive Western Desert Aboriginal rock art sites. This morning, enjoy guided walks around the Durba Hills taking in some of the art sites. The afternoon can be spent at your leisure. Meals: B.L.D





Day 13 Well 16 through to Well 10



Well rested, we begin early and head south to Well 16. Here you'll learn of the area's torturous history before moving on to Well 15, where we stop at the lookout for morning tea. Next, we pass Wells 14 and 13 before reaching Well 12, which offers excellent drinking water thanks to a recent restoration. After replenishing our water supplies, we continue on to McConkey Hill near Well 10 and set up camp. Meals: B.L.D

Day 14 Glen-Ayle Station - Wiluna - Well 1

Also known as Weld Springs, Well 9 is where the remote pastoral property Glen-Ayle Station begins, evident by the cattle yards and infrastructure. It's also where John Forrest, the first premier of Western Australia, was forced to build a small fort in 1874. Here, we deviate from the official stock route and travel through Glen-Ayle Station to Wiluna. After refuelling, we return to the stock route and set up camp at Well 1. Meals: B.L.D

Day 15 Hello Newman

Today marks the end of our journey along the Canning Stock Route as we meet up with the Great Northern Highway. Arrive into Newman early this afternoon and check in to the Seasons Hotel, with time to unwind before our final celebratory dinner together. Meals: B.L.D

Day 16 Farewell, But Not Goodbye

Enjoy breakfast together once more, before being transferred to the Newman airport for your flight to Perth*. Farewell, until your next Outback Spirit adventure! Meals: B

The Simpson Desert

The Explorers

•••••

The first European explorer to see the Simpson Desert was Charles Sturt, who visited the region in the 1840's. Despite several attempts, nearly 100 years would pass before the Simpson would be crossed in its entirety by a non-indigenous Australian. Ted Colson, a pastoralist and explorer from South Australia, set off with an Indigenous Australian named Eringa Peter from the Antakurinya tribe in May 1936 with the aim of crossing the desert west to east. Using camels to traverse the inhospitable landscape, they reached Birdsville in just over two weeks. After three days of rest, they turned around and made the return journey, covering a total of 600 miles in 36 days.

The Simpson Desert was named by Cecil Madigan, an Australian explorer and geologist from Renmark. Madigan took part in several expeditions in the 1930's to survey the interior, and in 1939 led a major expedition across the Simpson.

He named the desert in honour of Alfred Allen Simpson, the president of the South Australian branch of the Royal Geographical Society of Australasia. Interestingly, the Simpson family ran one of the country's largest metal manufacturing businesses in Adelaide in the late 1800's. In the 1940's, the company began making whitegoods including washing machines, which are still sold under the Simpson brand to this day.

Seismic Surveys

In the 1960's and 70's, various seismic surveys were carried out across the Simpson Desert in search of oil and gas. To determine the worth of its joint venture with leaseholder Delhi/SANTOS, The French Petroleum Company of Australia (FPCA) appointed another French firm, Compagnie Generale de Geophusique (CGG) to perform a seismic survey of the southern Simpson. The track which CGG pushed into the desert, aptly named the 'French Line' is still one of the major tracks used to cross the desert and is the most direct route from west to east.

Another of the tracks, the 'Rig Road' was also built in the 1960's. Located to the south of the French Line, the Rig Road was initially built to a standard for laden semitrailers by sheeting the tops of the dunes with clay. Looking at the track today, it's hard to imagine a truck and semi-trailer being even remotely capable of traversing the desert landscape.

Day 1

Your Adventure Begins in Alice Springs

Sandstone outcrops form natural galleries which contain a great variety of symbols and motifs.

Later this morning we continue heading south to Titjikala and visit the Tapatjatjaka Art and Craft Centre. Browse through the gallery and chat to local artists before heading west to Chambers Pillar Historical Reserve. Here, we'll set up camp and your crew will help you get familiarised with the equipment*. Late this afternoon, enjoy a walk to Chambers Pillar for a magnificent desert sunset. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Finke - Mt. Dare



This morning we depart Chambers Pillar and once again follow the Old Ghan Railway south. Your knowledgeable guides will tell you all about this fascinating part of Australian history as you head towards Finke. This afternoon we pass through Charlotte Waters, the site of an old Telegraph Repeater station built in 1872, before crossing the NT/SA border. From here we head into the vast Witjira National Park and on to Mt. Dare Hotel, the last we'll see of civilisation before heading into the desert. Here we'll make camp for the night and enjoy dinner at the hotel. Meals: B.L.D

Day 4

Dalhousie Springs – Simpson Desert Regional Reserve



Among the sand dunes and floodplains of the Simpson Desert's western edge lies a series of thermal springs surrounded by lush vegetation and an abundance of wildlife. Inscribed onto the Australian National Heritage List in 2009, Dalhousie Springs is the largest surface expression of the Great Artesian Basin and was used as a source of food and medicine by Aboriginal people for thousands of years. The springs are home to unique species of fish such as the Lake Eyre Hardyhead, and other rare aquatic life found nowhere else in the world. They're also a haven for arid-land birdlife.

This morning we arrive at Dalhousie Springs for morning tea and a swim in this beautiful oasis. We then begin our crossing of the Simpson Desert, the largest parallel sand dune desert in the world. In total, over 1100 dunes run parallel to one another from the Witjira National Park to Birdsville. Travelling east we cross the vast floodplains of Spring Creek Delta before arriving at the first of the dunes, which start out small and then gradually increase in size. Continue to Purni Bore, an uncapped bore from the 1960's which has created an artificial wetland in the desert. This afternoon, trek further into the Simpson before making camp along the French Line. Meals: B.L.D

Days 5, 6 & 7 Crossing the Simpson

Over the next three days we continue trekking east along the French Line but also follow other tracks including the WAA and K1 Lines. On occasions we'll divert down other seismic survey tracks to points of interest, such as the Approdinna Attora Knolls. Standing out amongst the red sand, these two flat topped hills of white gypseous rock were once dunes formed of flour gypsum that later hardened to their present form. Today they offer some of the best views in the Simpson.

Our camp sites for each evening will be between the Simpson's red dunes. Clumps of shady gidgee trees can be found in some of the dune corridors, which make for ideal campsites.

A climb to the top of the nearest dune at sunset is well worth the effort; the breathtaking view and change in colours a true feast for the eyes. In the evening, enjoy sitting around the campfire as your crew prepare dinner and explain the fascinating landscape. On clear nights, star gazing is truly an incredible experience in the Simpson.

On Day 7, travel south along the K1 line from Poeppel Corner to the Warburton Creek before meeting up with the Birdsville Track. From here we head north and arrive in Birdsville late afternoon for our two-night stay at the Birdsville Pub. Enjoy a few nights in relative luxury and prepare for the next leg of the journey! Meals: B.L.D - daily

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Day 8 **Birdsville Rest Day**

Today is a day of rest for passengers and crew alike. Catch up on some washing, visit some of the sights around town or wander down to the edge of the Diamantina River. Our meals for the day will be at the hotel. Meals: B.L.D

Day 9 Birdsville - Nappanerica - Madigan Line

Time to saddle up again and head back in to the mighty Simpson. Our first challenge for the day is Nappanerica (Big Red) which affords sensational panoramic views over the desert plains once the top is reached. From here we take the QAA line to the Eyre Creek, where we'll start trekking north along the Madigan Line through Adria Downs Station (Adria Downs is private property. Outback Spirit has special permission to traverse through the station).

Learn about the history of Annandale Station, the first QLD station purchased by Sir Sidney Kidman in 1896. This afternoon we make camp along the Eyre Creek. Meals: B.L.D

Day 10 **Hay River Track**

In the winter of 1939, explorer Cecil Madigan from Renmark undertook a crossing of the Simpson Desert with a party of nine, including a biologist, botanist, photographer and a radio operator. With nineteen camels, the expedition team made the exhausting crossing from Andado Station in the Northern Territory to Birdsville in twenty-five days. The expedition is regarded as one of the last classic Australian exploration adventures. It also pioneered the use of mobile radio communication, with national broadcasts being made through the ABC from desert camps along the journey.

This morning we pass by Madigan Camps 21 and 20 before entering the Munga-Thirri (Simpson Desert) National Park. Heading west, we start climbing the dunes again before arriving at the intersection of the Hay River Track and Madigan's Camp 16, where there is a Eucalypt with a faint blaze from Madigan's 1939 expedition. From here we head north, travelling within the dune corridors alongside the Hay River. Despite the river being mainly dry, there are some towering River Red Gums in sections. This afternoon we make camp in a picturesque spot beside the river. Meals: B.L.D

Day 11 Hay River Track - Lake Caroline -**Tropic of Capricorn**

Our journey today continues alongside the Hay River and up to Lake Caroline, a vast claypan that on occasions contains water. After lunch, continue heading north to the Tropic of Capricorn, where we'll set up camp nearby. Meals: B.L.D





Tropic of Capricorn - Batton Hill Camp



This morning we pass by Vantage Point, with views to Mt Winnecke. We then follow the Hay River to Batton Hill Camp, a serviced camp site managed by Traditional Owners in the far north of the Simpson. After setting up camp, we head off on a guided tour to Goyder's Pillar. We'll be accompanied by a local Indigenous guide who'll also share their knowledge about the local country including the various bush tucker found in the area. We then return to camp and soak up the majesty of the Simpson for the last time. Meals: B.L.D

Day 13 Batton Hill Camp - Alice Springs

Returning to civilisation, we pack up camp for the final time and trek west to join up with the Plenty Highway. From here we'll travel alongside Harts Range before passing through Gemtree and joining up

to the Stuart Highway. From here it's just a short run south to where it all began - Alice Springs. Arriving mid-afternoon, we check in to the Mercure Alice Springs Resort for the final night of our adventure. Enjoy a celebratory dinner together and relive the expedition with your fellow travellers. Meals: B.L.D

Day 14 **Tour concludes**

After breakfast this morning you'll be transferred to the airport or to your accommodation if staying on in 'the Alice'. Meals: B



Fittingly the track Bill traversed on his ranging days, linking some of the Northern Territory's hidden National Park gems, bears his name. Bill's dream to one day create a track that would give tourists the opportunity to explore the outback and the magnificent rock formations, native wildlife, and bountiful colours has now been realised creating one of the Territories latest touring marvels.

Along its full course, the Binns Track stretches from Mount Dare to Timber Creek – a significant slice of Central Australia bursting with colours, native wildlife and mighty rock formations.

"This journey traverses some of the most untouched parts and unused Parks in the Territory and it highlights its changing vistas – from Australia's sandy heart to the rugged outcrops of Gregory National Park and sub-tropics of the north."

Itinerary 13 Days | Alice Springs - Kununurra (and vice versa)



Binns Track

Covering some 2,200 kilometres, the Binns Track winds through many of the Northern Territory's lesser-known, yet no-less spectacular Nature Reserves and National Parks

Your journey

Day 1

Your Adventure Begins in Alice Springs

Upon your arrival in Alice Springs today you'll be met at the airport by your friendly and professional safari crew. We then head to the Mercure Alice Springs Resort, followed by a comprehensive trip briefing with your fellow travellers. This evening, enjoy a welcome dinner in the hotel restaurant. *Meals: D*

Day 2

East MacDonnell Ranges - N'Dhala Gorge - Trephina Gorge - Hale River



Today the adventure begins as we depart Alice Springs and head east through the beautiful East MacDonnell Ranges. Our first stop is Corroboree Rock Conservation Reserve, an impressive dolomite structure which is an important sacred site in Arrernte culture. We then head on to Trephina Gorge, where a 20-minute walk takes us to a lookout with dramatic views over the surrounding country.

After lunch, visit N'Dhala Nature Park and Ross River before arriving at Hale River Homestead on Ambalindum Station, right in the heart of the East MacDonnell Ranges. Set up camp and enjoy two nights in this beautiful location. Enjoy a late afternoon drink by the fire pit before dinner this evening in the Sydney William Shed, known as 'The Workshop'. *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 3 Arltunga Historical Area – Ruby Gap



Officially central Australia's first town, Arltunga was once a site of hope, struggle and mateship for many fortune hunters who came to the area on foot to find gold in the 1880's. Enjoy a guided walk here (easy grade) to the Golden Chance Mine and visit some old stone houses that are perhaps some of the most well-constructed stone dwellings in the Northern Territory. Using only dry dirt due to a lack of water, the high level of workmanship is evident in their construction.

After morning tea we continue to Ruby Gap, driving along the Hale River bed for part of the journey. Enjoy lunch and explore the area before returning to Hale River late this afternoon. Dinner this evening is again in 'The Workshop' with an open fire (meals supplied by Hale River Homestead). *Meals: B.L.D*

Day 4 Gemtree - Plenty Highway -Harts Range - Derry Downs

This morning we bid farewell to Hale River Homestead and follow the official Binns Track through to Pinnacles Bore. From here, we follow the Pinnacles track through to the Plenty Highway before arriving at Gemtree mid-morning. After some morning tea, visit the original Mount Riddock Homestead, relocated to Gemtree where interesting story boards of a past pioneering way of life are displayed.

Tour highlights

- Visit the remote and spectacular lytwelepenty / Davenport Ranges National Park, home to cool waterways and stunning gorges. Enjoy a guided walk and cool off in Old Police Station Waterhole
- Travel the Frew River 4WD Loop and Pinnacles Track
- View ancient petroglyphs that trace the history of the Arrernte people at N'Dhala Gorge
- Travel remote station tracks between the Plenty and Sandover Highways
- Visit the Arltunga Historical Reserve and Ruby Gap Nature Park
- Pass through the breathtaking scenery of rugged Harts Range
- Visit Karlu Karlu / Devils Marbles and enjoy this ancient natural wonder
- Visit Frew Ponds Overland Telegraph Line Memorial Reserve
- Travel the Buchanan Highway and on to Victoria River Downs, one of the NT's largest cattle stations
- Explore the vast escarpments and lofty gorges of Judbarra / Gregory National Park
- Traverse the Humbert Track visiting Jasper Gorge, Limestone Gorge, Bullita Homestead and Gregory's Tree
- Visit the Victoria River Research Station on Kidman springs

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We then trek east along the Plenty to Harts Range, an area popular with gem fossickers and home to one of the most isolated police stations in the world. Interestingly, between the 1890's and the close of the mine in 1960, almost all the nation's mica came from this area in the Northern Territory. Enjoy lunch and a look around before heading further north on the Binns Track past MacDonald Downs. The property was originally settled by Charles Chalmers and his wife Cora in the early 1920's. A school teacher from Mungindi in NSW, Charles dreamed of one day being a farmer and moved to the area, against all advice from family and friends. A fascinating story, and one of your guides will offer more details this evening around the camp fire at Derry Downs, tonight's overnight stop. Meals: B.L.D

Day 5 Sandover Highway - lytwelepenty / **Davenport Ranges National Park**



This morning we depart Derry Downs and once again follow the Binns Track north. Briefly travel the Sandover highway, the linking track between Mt. Isa and Alice Springs, before continuing north up to the lytwelepenty / Davenport Ranges National Park - one of the most beautiful and least known Parks in the country. Here we tackle the Frew River Loop 4WD track and make our way to an area known as Old Police Water Hole, one of the most scenic and tranquil parts of the National Park and the perfect spot to set up for a two-night stay. Meals: B.L.D

lytwelepenty / Davenport Ranges



The lytwelepenty / Davenport Ranges National Park protects the important environmental zone between the Top End and Central Australia. The Park covers an area of 1,120 km² and is bordered by several pastoral leases and lands of The Anurrete Aboriginal Land Trust. It's a serene oasis that few have ever visited, and to this day it remains very much 'off the beaten track'. In terms of bird watching, black-faced cuckoo shrikes, rainbow bee-eaters, spinifex pigeons, diamond and peaceful doves, flocks of budgies and myriad honeyeaters are all common in the area.

Today we enjoy a number of short guided walks exploring and embracing the park's peaceful waterways and stunning gorges. Meals: B.L.D.

Day 7 Whistleduck Water Hole -Karlu Karlu / Devils Marbles



Time to saddle up again and continue our journey along the Binns Track. Today we pass through Epenarra before turning west towards the Stuart Highway. Briefly travel south to arrive at Karlu Karlu / Devils Marbles Conservation Reserve for an early lunch. Marvel at this exquisite natural wonder before trekking further north to Tennant Creek, where we overnight in accommodation at the Bluestone Motor Inn. Catch up on some washing before enjoying dinner this evening in the motel restaurant. Meals: B.L.D

Tennant Creek - Battery Hill - Newcastle Waters - Murranji

After breakfast we'll visit the Battery Hill Mining Centre for an underground mine tour before heading north on the Stuart Highway. Pass through Renner Springs and the historic Newcastle Waters Station before heading west on the Buchanan Highway. Shortly after crossing the Australasia Railway we'll make camp for the night. Under the desert stars your experienced guides will fill you in on the area's fascinating droving history and infamous Murranji Stock Route. Meals: B.L.D

Day 9

Top Springs - Victoria River Downs - Judbarra / Gregory National Park

After an early breakfast we pack up camp and continue west to Top Springs. After a brief stop, we head on to one of the most iconic cattle stations in the country -Victoria River Downs (or VRD as it's commonly referred to). Still covering some 2.5 million acres and running 33,000 head of cattle, the station has been a stock breeding powerhouse since it was established back in 1880.

This afternoon we head up to the Victoria River Research Station on Kidman Springs, the Territory's principal pastoral research centre occupying 34,000 hectares in the heart of the Victoria River district. The station's research projects have had a lasting impact on the productivity of the north Australian cattle industry and on the sustainability of the pastoral landscape. After a preview of the operations we head back down to VRD, where we make camp under the shade of some old Mahogany trees on the station Meals: B.L.D.



VRD - Judbarra / Gregory National Park **Bullita Homestead**



This morning we depart VRD and enter the Judbarra / Gregory National Park, the Territory's second largest park jointly managed with Traditional Owners. The park features some spectacular scenery, some of which we'll be exploring today. As we travel along the Humbert Track, we'll pass by Top Numbert Yard and Fig Tree Yard before arriving at Bullita Homestead. The track is slow going in places, but the scenery is well worth it! On the banks of the East Baines River, the old Bullita Homestead and stockyards are a reminder of the Park's pastoral history and great place to set up camp. Enjoy a wander through its historic buildings before dinner under the stars. Meals: B.L.D

Day 11 Bullita - Jasper Gorge



This morning we take a short drive to picturesque Limestone Gorge. For those interested there's an easy to moderate 1.8km return walk that winds its way through the limestone landscape with views over the East Baines River valley. Then, we'll take the Tuwakam Track across to the Buchanan Highway where we visit Jasper Gorge and set up camp for the night. Meals: B.L.D

Day 12

Timber Creek - Kununurra



Today we depart Jasper Gorge and head into Timber Creek, the official end point of the Binns Track located on the banks of the Victoria River. We then head west and visit the Gregory Tree before continuing on towards the Western Australia border, arriving at Lake Argyle for a picnic lunch.

This afternoon we enjoy a spectacular cruise down the Ord River to Kununurra. Learn about the Ord River Irrigation Scheme from your knowledgeable skipper on this extraordinary 3-hour adventure, arriving into Kununurra just as the sun sets on the horizon. Here you'll be met by your expedition crew before being transferred to the Kununurra Country Club Resort for the final night of the adventure. Tonight, we gather for dinner at the hotel restaurant and celebrate our adventure along the Binns Track. Meals: B.L.D

Day 13

Kununurra Township - Darwin

Enjoy breakfast and a leisurely morning before being transferred to the airport. Then, board your Air North flight to Darwin (please enquire for flight times). Bon Voyage! Meals: B



- (1) you have made the booking, complete with all information we require;
- (2) youhavepaidustheDeposit(orotheramountsowingatthetimeofbooking), according to the terms of this agreement; and
- (3) we have sent you a Booking Confirmation.

INCLUSIONS All goods and services that are included in your journey are as listed in the brochure and the website as at the date of booking.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS Passengers must notify us of any special requirements (for example diet) at the time the booking is made. We will advise all third parties such as hotels and attractions of these requirements and will endeavour to ensure they are met. However, we cannot guarantee that all special requirements will be met in all instances.

2. PAYMENT

FARE The Fare for your journey is the amount stated in your Booking Confirmation. Fares are per person twin share. Single supplements are applicable for single travellers requesting single accommodation. Forced singles are also required to pay the single supplement (land adventures). There are 2 fare tiers:

- **Everyday** fares for standard booking conditions
- Fully Flexible fares for maximum booking flexibility

All fares include Australian Goods and Services Tax (GST) and are quoted in Australian Dollars (\$AUD).

DEPOSITS To confirm a tour booking, payment must be made at the time of making the reservation. A Deposit or full Fare, depending on the fare type chosen, is payable at the time of booking by direct deposit or credit card.

For **Everyday** fares the booking deposit will be 25% of the tour fare per person. For **Everyday Past Passenger** fares the booking deposit will be 15% of the tour fare per person.

For **Fully Flexible** fares the booking deposit will be 100% of the tour fare per person.

PAYMENT Where applicable, the Balance (the difference between the Deposit and the Fare) must be received no later than 100 days prior to the date of travel. For bookings made within 100 days of the date of travel, the Balance will be required within 7 days, and in all cases before the date of travel.

CREDIT CARDS We accept Visa and Mastercard. Charges of 1% apply.

3. LUGGAGE LIMITS

Each Passenger is entitled to take one medium size suitcase or soft bag weighing no more than 16 kg. The sum of each case's width, length and depth is not to exceed 150cm. Passengers may also take on board the coach one hand-luggage item to be stored in the overhead luggage racks. Weight of hand luggage is not to exceed 3 kg per person.

Exceptions Due to operational considerations, some of our adventures and shorts breaks have different luggage restrictions.

- Desert Safaris: Weight of suitcase/soft bag not to exceed 14kgs
- Wet Season Spectacular: Weight of suitcase/soft bag not to exceed 12kgs
 Sayan Spirit Day Short Brooks & Fire Popingula Whole & Soft and Advantures.
- Seven Spirit Bay Short Breaks & Eyre Peninsula Whale & Seafood Adventures: Weight of suitcase/soft bag not to exceed 15kgs

Please note that Luggage limits are enforced on every tour. Passengers will be asked to leave their excess baggage behind in the event that the weight of the luggage exceeds our limits. The luggage is entirely at the passenger's risk during the tour.

4. TRAVEL INSURANCE

Outback Spirit strongly recommends passengers take out travel insurance to cover any unforeseen circumstances. We recommend that you do this at the time of booking.

5. ON BOARD WITH US

NO SMOKING POLICY Our vessels and vehicles are all entirely smoke free in accordance with relevant state and territory government regulations. Passengers are not to smoke (including e-cigarettes) while on board.

SEAT ALLOCATIONS Seat allocations on board Outback Spirit vehicles operate with a daily seat rotation system to ensure passengers enjoy different seating positions whilst on tour.

HEALTH

- Vaccination Policy Covid-19 vaccinations will be mandatory for all guests; exemptions will be granted where they have a verified contraindication to all available COVID vaccines. Exempt guests will be required to record a negative PCR test no more than 72 hours prior to their journey. If you are not or will not be vaccinated against COVID prior to travel, please contact our friendly travel consultants to discuss.
- Fitness Most of our tour itineraries contain guided sightseeing walks to natural attractions. As such, passengers are required to have a reasonable level of fitness in order to participate. Some walking tracks have sections of uneven rocky ground and may be slippery. The walks on our tours vary in length, so please read your chosen itinerary for further information or contact one of our friendly travel consultants who will be able to describe the walk to you. If passengers feel they are unable to participate in the walk on the day, alternative arrangements will be made with adequate provision for passenger comfort and safety.
- Hydration Whilst on a bushwalk it is the responsibility of each passenger to carry adequate drinking water. All Outback Spirit coaches feature a water refilling point.
- Mobility Passengers are required to have a reasonable level of mobility to
 be able to board and alight the coach unaided. Due to space restrictions
 aboard our coaches, we are unable to accommodate passengers who
 require the use of wheelchairs or walkers. Our vehicles are not equipped
 with wheelchair ramps or lifters. Passengers requiring physical or mental
 assistance must be accompanied by a companion who is willing and
 capable of providing such assistance.

ENJOYMENT Outback Spirit will take all reasonable steps to provide an enjoyable tour. However, no liability will be accepted for any loss of enjoyment experienced by passengers due to circumstances which are out of our control.

SAFETY Passengers accept that tours include participation in Recreational Services and Recreational Activities which may involve certain risks and dangers beyond the control of Outback Spirit. Such activities containing risks include but are not limited to: bush walking, swimming, and travelling in remote undeveloped locations. The passenger acknowledges that all Recreational Services and Recreational Activities in connection with the journey are undertaken of the passenger's own free will and at the passenger's own risk.

Passengers will not be permitted to continue on tours when in the opinion of the Outback Spirit Tour Leader, the passenger's conduct or condition is placing their own or the safety of other passengers at risk, or is adversely affecting the enjoyment of other passengers; for whatever cause.

TRAVELLING TO REMOTE AREAS Passengers accept that some itineraries include visits to and overnight stays in remote areas located some distance from hospitals, medical centres or other forms of professional medical facilities. This is particularly the case for Outback Spirit's Desert Safaris which travel through extremely remote country for days on end.

6. AMENDMENTS AND CANCELLATIONS

GUEST AMENDMENTS (STANDARD) For Outback Spirit land adventures only: Subject to availability, you may amend your booking. If an alternate date is unavailable or unsuitable and you cannot travel on the original date your booking will be subject to our standard cancellation terms detailed below.

Amendments for **Everyday** and **Everyday Past Passenger** bookings are permitted up to 45 days prior to departure. Amendment fees from any third parties who are supplying components of the booking (for example hotels or attractions) may apply.

Amendments for **Fully Flexible** bookings are permitted up to 1 day prior to departure

For all bookings (Everyday, Everyday Past Passenger and Fully Flexible):

- Transferring to a new calendar year will attract the applicable tour fare for that season
- Amendment fees from any third parties who are supplying components of the booking (for example hotels or attractions) may apply
- Guests will be subject to any fare differences which may apply when amending travel date

GUEST AMENDMENTS (DUE TO GOVERNMENT ENACTED BORDER CLOSURES) Amendments for Everyday and Everyday Past Passenger bookings within 45 days of travel up until departure date (due to Government enacted border closures) can be moved to any future travel date (pricing honoured until December 2024) or receive a future travel voucher. This voucher will be valid for a period of 24 months from your original tour departure date and can be used for any Journey Beyond travel experience. Amendment fees from any third parties who are supplying components of the booking (for example hotels or attractions) may apply. Amendments for Fully Flexible bookings are permitted up to 1 day prior to departure.

GUEST CANCELLATIONS If you cancel your booking with us, you must notify us in writing or by email to info@outbackspirit.net.au and pay a cancellation fee in the amount set out below.

OUR CANCELLATIONS If an event occurs that is outside of our control and not reasonably foreseeable or preventable by our business and this event leads to the suspension or cancellation of your tour booking, we will provide you with a credit voucher equal to the value of the monies paid for that booking. This voucher will be valid for a period of 24 months from your original tour departure date and can be used for any Journey Beyond travel experience. Amendment fees from any third parties who are supplying components of the booking (for example hotels or attractions) may apply. No amendment fee applies for **Fully Flexible** fare bookings.

RESPONSIBILITY & LIABILITY Outback Spirit accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury, loss, damage, change of itinerary or inconvenience caused either directly or indirectly as a result of events which are outside of our control, including but not limited to: fires, floods, acts of God, unusually severe weather, riot, war, invasion, medical outbreak or contamination of any kind, material change in legislation or government directions, industrial action or commercial flight disruptions.

Passengers are advised that the service provided by Outback Spirit is for the booking and packaging of goods and services provided by other operators such as hotels, motels, attractions, cruise lines, airlines and other transportation companies. Outback Spirit will not be liable for any loss, damage, omission or act of negligence or otherwise committed by these operators, their assignees or agents

Outback Spirit is unable to guarantee exact arrival or departure times and is not liable for any failure to make connections with any other service or guarantee the operation of any particular service.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION Should any dispute arise between Outback Spirit and a Passenger, the parties agree that formal proceedings in a Court or Tribunal will not commence until after the following process has been followed:

- A party provides written notice specifying the nature of the dispute ("the notice").
- The parties will in good faith attempt to resolve the dispute.
- If the dispute is not resolved within 7 days of receipt of the notice, the parties agree to refer the dispute to mediation administered by the Australian Disputes Centre and conducted in accordance with the ADC Guidelines for Commercial Mediation
- If there is no resolution to the dispute at the expiration of 30 days from the receipt of the notice, formal proceedings may be commenced.

GOVERNING LAW The laws applicable in New South Wales govern these Terms and Conditions and the parties submit to the jurisdiction of the Courts and/or Tribunals of New South Wales to determine any disputes.

PRIVACY Outback Spirit respects your privacy and will only use your personal information in accordance with our Privacy Policy and in accordance with the Privacy Act 1988. You can obtain full details of how we collect, hold, use manage and disclose your personal information from our Privacy Policy, a copy of which may be obtained free of charge by ringing us on 1800 688 222 or by visiting our website at www.outbackspirittours.com.au/privacy.
