Additionally, with Starlink WiFi on board, you can stay connected even in the remotest corners of the outback.

A safer way to travel

Mercedes-Benz builds some of the safest vehicles on the market, and ours are custom fitted for outback conditions. But the real difference is who's behind the wheel. Our drivers know these roads like the back of their hand, every creek crossing, every seasonal challenge, every section that requires local knowledge and experience. Mobility Requirements

Our vehicles are designed for rugged terrain, which means they sit higher off the ground than standard coaches. To board, guests will need to climb a set of tall steps unassisted each day. While this is a basic mobility requirement, most guests find it manageable, and we provide plenty of time for boarding and disembarking. If you're comfortable with everyday walking and climbing a few steps, you'll be ready to enjoy the journey.

Reconciliation Action Plan

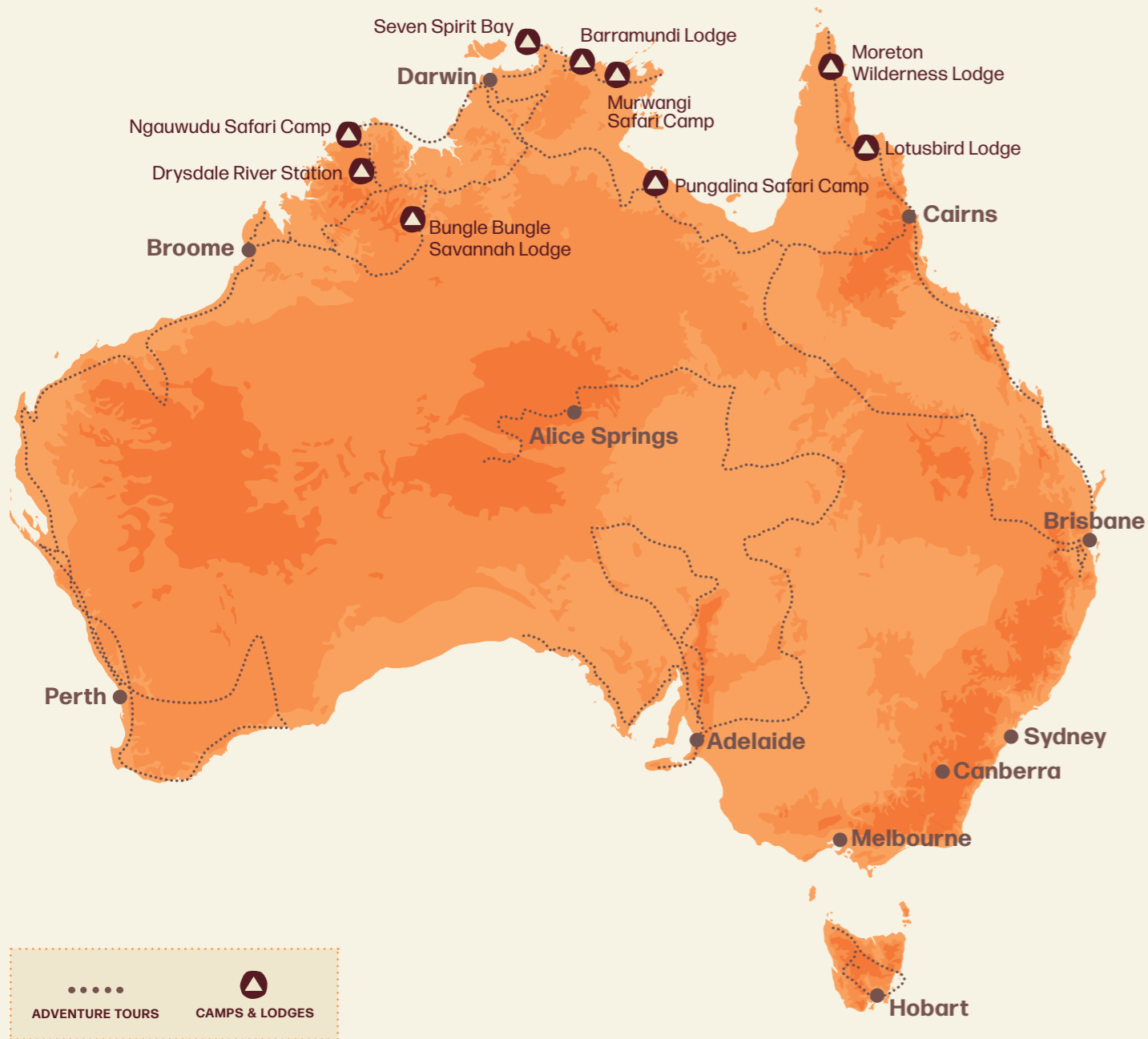

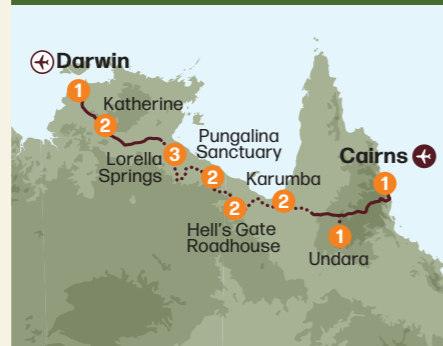

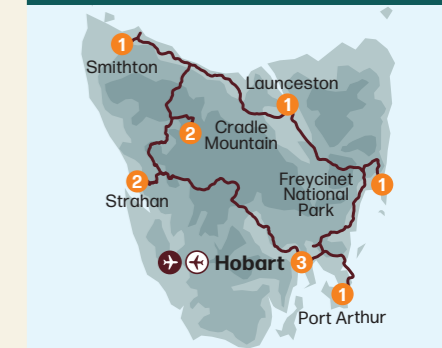

Your Journey

Day 1: Welcome to Arnhem Land

Arrive in Arnhem Land, one of Australia's last untouched regions, on your included flight from Cairns and meet your professional Tour Director in Nhulunbuy. After settling in, set off to explore this remote frontier township, taking in sweeping views from Roy (Malpi) Marika Lookout, the serene Gayngaru Wetlands, and the picturesque Gove Harbour, a hub for fishing and boating. **D**

Stay: 2 nights at Walkabout Lodge

Note: Arrival via Darwin is available at an extra cost, with a discount offered.

Day 2: Exploring the Gove Peninsula

Your introduction to Yolngu culture begins with a special 'Welcome to Country' ceremony at Wirrawuy Beach, where we'll learn about community and kinship firsthand. Continue with a visit to the Buku-Larrnggay Mulka art centre and Shady Beach, before experiencing a Bush Medicine and Women's Healing demonstration. **B.L.D**

Day 3: Journey to Murwangi

Adventure awaits as we journey into the heart of Arnhem Land, with unsurpassed access to this mystical and sacred place. Boarding Outback Spirit's custom all-terrain 4WD coach, we travel the rugged Central Arnhem Road southwest to the Goyder River, the main tributary feeding the vast and ecologically rich Arafura Swamp. This area is known as 'Murwangi'. You'll spend two nights at the sensational tented safari camp exclusive to Outback Spirit, situated on the banks of Arafura Swamp. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Murwangi Safari Camp

Day 4: Arafura Swamp and Murwangi Discovery Tour

The Arafura Swamp is one of Australia's largest wooded wetlands, both culturally sacred and ecologically significant to the Yolngu People. Soak up the morning light as you cruise through the main lagoon, then enjoy a different perspective with a 4WD adventure around the edge. For both activities we'll be accompanied by Indigenous guides, who will explain why this spectacular area is so significant. **B.L.D**

Note: Today the tour splits into two groups for activities. Group 1 will follow the itinerary shown above, while Group 2 will do the activities in reverse.

Day 5: Ramingining - Barramundi Lodge

Setting out to explore this morning, we enjoy a visit to Bula'Bula Art Centre in Ramingining for a lesson in Indigenous art. Travelling west, we venture deeper into Arnhem Land, crossing the Blyth and Cadell Rivers on our way to Maningrida, and arrive at the exclusive Barramundi Lodge by early afternoon. The lodge offers premium safari suites and the perfect sunset vantage point on the restaurant's large deck. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Barramundi Lodge

Day 6: Fishing Adventure

Embark on a unique guided fishing adventure on the Liverpool and Tomkinson Rivers, offering opportunities to catch barramundi and immerse yourself in the region's remote riverine environment. This experience is equally rewarding for non-anglers, with stunning scenery and rich cultural context shared by your guides. Later, visit the Maningrida Arts & Culture Centre and the Djomi Museum for deeper insight into local stories and creative traditions. **B.L.D**



Murwangi Discovery Tour, Arafura Swamp, NT

Day 7: Maningrida - Mount Borradaile

Departing Maningrida, our travels take us through the stone country of west Arnhem Land. Cross the Goomadeer and Liverpool Rivers on our way to Davidson's Arnhemland Safaris, an Advanced Ecotourism certified property located on a remote 700 square-kilometre holding at Mount Borradaile. From here, we travel along a 40km bush track to the safari lodge, arriving in time for lunch. This afternoon, the highly trained staff at Mount Borradaile will take you through 60,000 years of Aboriginal culture in a truly awe-inspiring landscape. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Davidson's Arnhemland Safari Lodge

Mount Borradaile Rainbow Serpent: 1 km, 2 hours

The walk involves rocks, climbing, tree roots, sandy sections, and exploring small caves.

We continue north, fording the King Edward River before visiting a series of remarkable Wanjina rock art sites. These sacred places hold deep cultural significance and are considered among the most extraordinary in the Kimberley. Journey through ancient Livistona palm forests before arriving at Ngauwudu Safari Camp, a secluded retreat reserved exclusively for Outback Spirit guests. Take a dip in the camp's private palm-fringed waterhole or simply relax in your Safari Suite before a sunset drink around the campfire to unwind from a day on the road. **B.L.D**
Stay: 2 nights at Ngauwudu Safari Camp

Day 6: Punamii-Uunpuu (Mitchell Falls)

After a short drive to the ranger station, we'll set off on a guided 4km walking tour to the incredible four-tiered Punamii-Uunpuu, Mitchell Falls (a good level of fitness and mobility are required with some rock-hopping). Accompanied by a Wunambal Gaambera Traditional Owner, we'll discover incredible Gwion and Wanjina cultural art sites. Our walk takes us past Bunjani (Mertens Falls), before arriving at the top of Punamii-Uunpuu, one of the most awe-inspiring natural wonders of the Kimberley. Find the perfect picnic spot and admire the falls, then we'll take to the skies for a short but spectacular helicopter flight to experience Mitchell Falls from a bird's-eye view and return (included) back to where the walk started. **B.L.D**

Mitchell Plateau: 4 km, 3 - 4 hours

After feeding the cheeky archerfish, we head to Zebedee Thermal Springs, where warm, crystal-clear waters invite a relaxing soak beneath swaying palms. Choose your own adventure in the afternoon selecting to either unwind at the resort or take on a guided hike to Emma Gorge's breathtaking waterfall (2.5 hours return). A good level of fitness is required for this walk; however, a swim in its cool, emerald pool is just reward for effort. **B.L.D**

Emma Gorge: 3 km, 2 - 3 hours

The walk becomes increasingly difficult with rock scrambling, creek crossings, and a steep uphill climb at the end.

Day 9: Wyndham - Five Rivers Lookout - Parry Lagoons

Departing El Questro, we head to Wyndham and the Five Rivers Lookout to take in views over Cambridge Gulf and see where five mighty Kimberley rivers meet and flow into the ocean. En route, we'll also visit Parry Lagoons Nature Reserve, an important breeding area for a vast array of birdlife with over 160 species recorded. We then make our way to Kununurra, the vibrant hub of the East Kimberley, for our two-night stay. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Kununurra Country Club Resort

Day 10: Kununurra - Lake Argyle - Ord River

Ease into the day with time to explore Kununurra, a town born from the ambitious Ord River Irrigation Scheme. Our explorations take us to the magnificent Lake Argyle, WA's largest freshwater man-made reservoir with a stop at the historic Durack Homestead, home to original European settlers of the Kimberley. This afternoon, a three-hour Ord River cruise showcases the region's stunning landscapes, abundant wildlife, and rich history, ending with a spectacular sunset return to Kununurra. **B.L.D**

Day 11: Head to the Bungle Bungle Range

Before departing Kununurra, we'll explore the fertile farming country. Drive through parts of the massive Ord River Irrigation Scheme, where an abundance of crops such as melons, mangoes, sandalwood and more are grown. From here, we begin our journey south to the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park, arriving in time for a late-afternoon sundowner. Echidna Chasm: 2 km, 1 hour

Be guided through this natural wonder which is part of the 350-million-year-old Devonian Reef system. Listen to Dreamtime stories and learn about one of the most significant Devonian fossil sites in the world from the local Gooniyandi people. Enjoy freshly brewed tea and damper before continuing our journey on the Great Northern Highway to our destination this evening, the town of Fitzroy Crossing. **B.L.D**

Weather and tide permitting, we travel along the coast past Koolama Bay, where the merchant vessel Koolama was bombed during World War II - a powerful story of survival, mutiny, and endurance. From here, journey upriver, dwarfed by towering red cliffs, and edge towards the falls for a truly exhilarating 'shower' beneath their thundering cascade.

At the entrance of the King George River, you can't help but feel dwarfed by the towering red rocky cliffs rising high above us. From here, meander upriver to the incredible Falls, and if conditions allow, you'll be able to take an invigorating waterfall shower as the boat edges to within metres of the rock face.

With plenty of time to soak up the spellbinding Falls, we'll then make our way back to the lodge. Enjoy some fishing on the way and keep an eye out for other marine life including crocodiles, dolphins, dugong and manta rays to name just a few. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Cooina Lodge

Day 3: The Mystery of Arnhem Land

The day begins with breathtaking views over the Arnhem Land floodplains from Ubirr Rock, a sacred site where ancient rock art will be revealed. Then, cross the East Alligator River and venture into Arnhem Land for a visit to the Injalak Arts and Crafts Centre, in Gunbalanya. This afternoon, we return to Cooina and enjoy the renowned wildlife cruise on Yellow Water Billabong, a birdwatcher's paradise. **B.L.D**

Day 4: Katherine River Gorge

Making tracks south, we are bound for Katherine and Nitmiluk National Park, home to Katherine River Gorge. A stunning natural landmark carved through ancient sandstone by the Katherine River, this deep gorge with towering sheer rock walls is one of the best in the Territory. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Cicada Lodge

Day 5: WA Border

Time to leave the Territory and cross into Western Australia. Pass through Victoria River and Timber Creek before heading to Lake Argyle one of the largest man-made lakes in the southern hemisphere. We'll stop off at the historic Durack Homestead to learn about the early pastoral settlers of this area.

Enjoy a tour through parts of the massive Ord River Irrigation Scheme on Ivanhoe Plains where melons, mangoes, sandalwood and other crops are plentiful. There'll also be time to explore Kununurra the gateway to the East Kimberley and see why the name means 'big water' in local Aboriginal language. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Kununurra Country Club Resort

Day 6: Ord River Cruise - Head to the Bungle Bungle Range

Before departing Kununurra we enjoy another river cruise, this time down the spectacular Ord River. Learn about the Ord River Irrigation Scheme from your knowledgeable skipper on this extraordinary three-hour adventure. Later this morning we head south, passing through Mabel Downs Station, en route to the World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge

Day 7: Purnululu National Park

Explore the wonders of the World Heritage-listed Purnululu, with a breathtaking scenic helicopter flight over the park, providing a bird's-eye view of its astounding 350-million-year-old natural features. Afterwards, a guided walk leads us through Piccaninny Creek to the towering Cathedral Gorge before following the Dome Trail for a closer look at the park's iconic rock formations. This afternoon, explore Echidna Chasm, a popular walking trail known for its orange glow gorge walls. **B.L.D**

Echidna Chasm: 2 km, 1 hour

The walk follows a dry, rocky riverbed with some steps over boulders and two short ladders with handrails.

Cathedral Gorge: 2 km, 2 hours

The walk is mostly flat and easy, with some natural steps, uneven surfaces, and soft sand.

Day 8: North to El Questro

Retracing our steps north, we pause at Five Rivers Lookout for a scenic picnic lunch before joining the iconic Gibb River Road to venture into the heart of world renowned El Questro Wilderness Park, our home for the next two nights and base to explore the ancient landscapes. **B.L.D**
Stay: 2 nights at Emma Gorge Resort

Day 9: Exploring El Questro

Spend a relaxing morning in the warm, crystal clear waters of Zebedee Thermal Springs before visiting the hub of El Questro - the station township. This afternoon, enjoy the serene surroundings of Emma Gorge at leisure. You can choose to relax at the resort or take an invigorating guided walk to the breathtaking Emma Gorge waterfall. Stay: 2 nights at Ngauwudu Safari Camp

Day 11: Exploring Punamii-Uunpuu (Mitchell Falls)

arriving at the top of Punamii-Uunpuu. The adventure continues as we take to the skies for a spectacular helicopter flight (included) to marvel at the stunning views and return to where the walk started. **B.L.D**

Mitchell Plateau: 4 km, 3 - 4 hours

The walk is rough and uneven with steep sections, steps, and large boulders to climb.

Note: For guests not wishing to do the Mitchell Falls walk, an optional helicopter transfer is available to the top of the falls with local operators (at an additional cost).

Take a guided walk and enjoy a swim in the rock pools at the top of the waterfall. Mount Hart Station awaits, steeped in history and located on the lands of the Ngarinyin people. The property was established in 1914 as a working cattle station until it was declassified in 2000. This evening, enjoy a few drinks at the Settlers Bar before dinner. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Mount Hart Station

Bell Gorge: 2 km, 1 hour

The walk is rough and uneven with steeper sections, large rocks, a creek crossing, slippery areas, and an uphill return.

Day 14: Exploring Mount Hart

Step into the remote beauty of Mount Hart in the King Leopold Ranges, where our open-back safari trucks take us off-road to explore vast wilderness and hidden waterholes. Learn about the area's unique ecology and conservation efforts, take a refreshing swim, or simply soak in the tranquillity of this remote paradise. This afternoon, unwind at camp or wander through the gardens surrounding the lodge. **B.L.D**

Day 15: Windjana Gorge & Tunnel Creek

Our journey winds through the striking Wunaamin Miliwundi Ranges, leading us to Windjana Gorge National Park. A guided bush walk reveals its impressive ancient limestone walls, and you can spot resident freshwater crocodiles in this unforgettable setting. Then on to visit Dimalurru (Tunnel Creek), where water has carved a large tunnel through the limestone Napier Ranges. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Fitzroy River Lodge

Tunnel Creek: 1.5 km, 2 hours

The walk has uneven surfaces and a tricky cave entry, requiring help from others, with slippery rocks and boulders inside.

Day 16: Fitzroy - Derby - Broome

As we venture into Derby, we witness the ingenuity of the early farmers visiting Myalls Bore and Cattle Trough, the infamous Boab Prison Tree, and the unusual horseshoe shaped Derby Jetty. Enjoy a tour of Broome late afternoon, before checking into our accommodation for the final two nights of our adventure and soak in the spectacular sunsets that Broome is renowned for. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Cable Beach Club Resort and Spa

Day 17: Horizontal Falls

Start your day early as we set off on an unforgettable full-day adventure to Horizontal Falls and the Dampier Peninsula. Your day includes a breathtaking seaplane flight, offering panoramic views of the stunning Buccaneer Archipelago, before landing in the calm waters of Talbot Bay. Enjoy either a delicious hot breakfast, or locally sourced barramundi lunch prepared by your expert hosts at the Horizontal Falls houseboat.

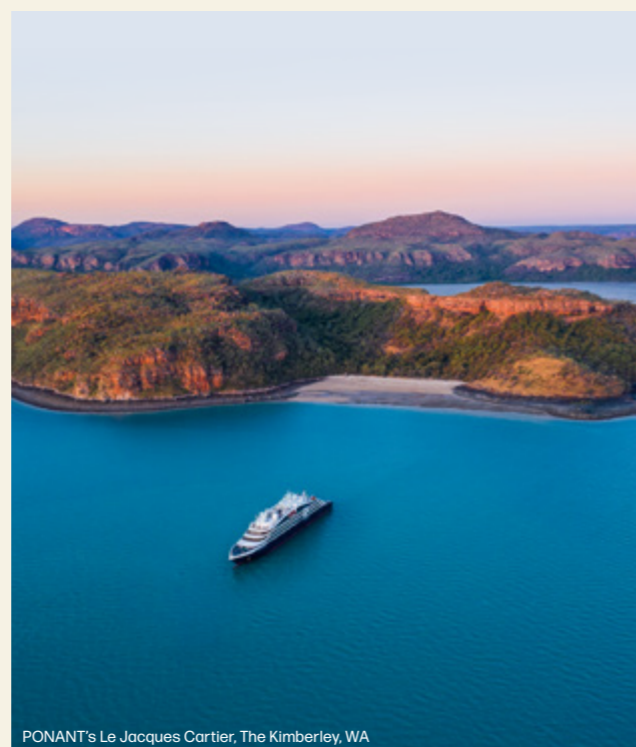

This morning is yours to explore Broome at your leisure. In the afternoon, make your way to the Port of Broome to board Le Jacques Cartier or Le Soleal for your Kimberley cruising. **D**

Stay: 10 nights on Le Jacques Cartier / Le Soleal

Day 2: Lacepede Islands

The Lacepede Islands are Western Australia's most important breeding habitat for Green Turtles and have been named by BirdLife International as an Important Bird Area (IBA). Join your Expedition Team for a guided Zodiac tour to view the prolific wildlife. **B.L.D**

Day 3: Collier Bay

Lying to the east of the Buccaneer Archipelago, the ancient landscapes of Collier Bay have been shaped by massive tidal movements, creating a photographer's paradise. With a tidal range exceeding 14 metres, this movement of water creates a unique phenomenon. Nestled in the centre of the bay is Montgomery Reef, the world's largest inshore reef system. As the tide falls a raging torrent of water cascades off the top of the reef, creating turbulent 'rivers' and mini waterfalls. **B.L.D**

Day 4: Horizontal Falls

At the southern end of the Bay, Talbot Bay is home to the world's only 'Horizontal Falls', described by Sir David Attenborough as "one of the greatest

wonders of the natural world." Hidden in the many caves and grottos of this ancient landscape are a multitude of ancient rock art galleries. Activities here will be determined by the weather and tide conditions. **B.L.D**

Day 5: Careening Bay

Careening Bay was named by Lieutenant Phillip Parker King after his ship, HMC Mermaid, was careened there in 1820. King ran the leaking Mermaid onto the sands. As the crew worked hard to re-float the vessel, the ship's carpenter carved the name of the vessel and the year into a conspicuous boab tree. The boab tree is now three metres wide and National Heritage-listed. **B.L.D**

Day 6: Hunter River

Arguably one of the most scenic parts of the Kimberley coast, Prince Frederick Harbour and the Hunter River are lined with pockets of ancient rainforest, pristine mangroves and mosaic sandstone cliffs. The Expedition Team will share their knowledge as you explore by Zodiac, keeping a lookout for wildlife. You will also have the opportunity to reach the Mitchell Falls by helicopter from Naturalist Island beach. **B.L.D**

Day 7: Swift Bay

The Bonaparte Archipelago consists of a rugged maze of islands stretching almost 150kms along Western Australia's coast. Join your Expedition Team ashore for a guided walk to several rock art galleries depicting unique rock art styles. **B.L.D**

Day 8: Vansittart Bay

Jar Island contains ancient rock art galleries depicting the Gwion Gwion style unique to the Kimberley region. Join your Expedition Team ashore for a short walk, past some fascinating rock formations, to the site of the Gwion Gwion art galleries. **B.L.D**

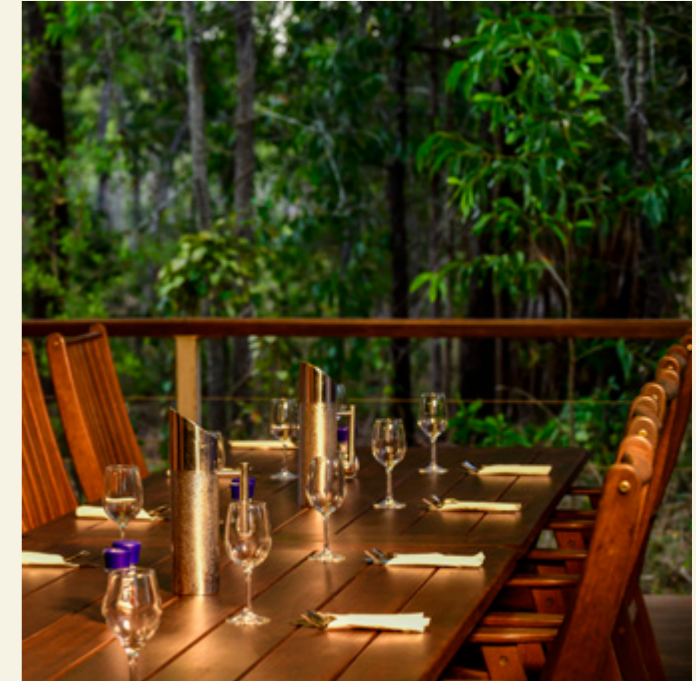

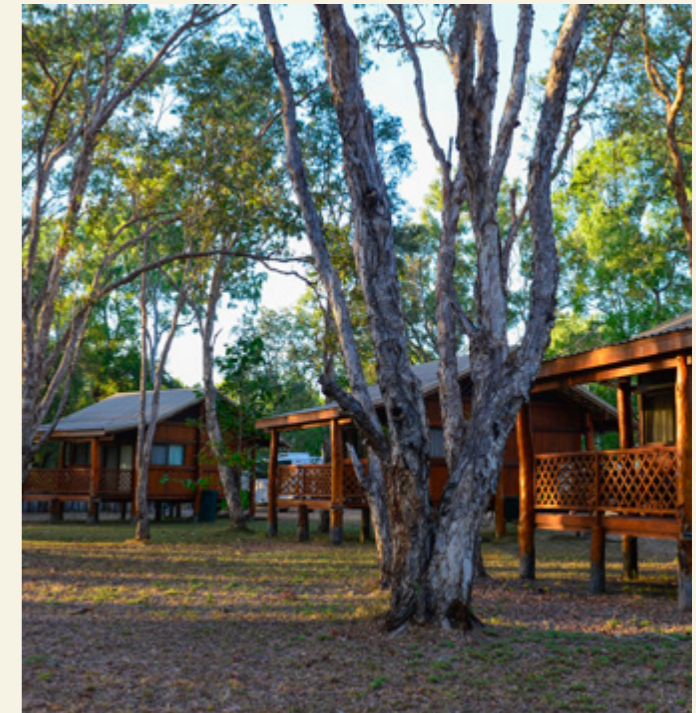

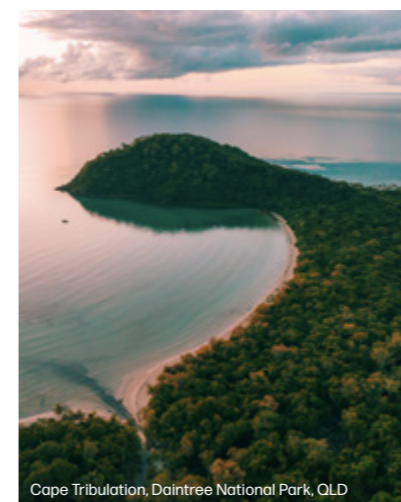

Take to the skies for a breathtaking helicopter flight over Rinyirru (Lakefield National Park), soaring above shimmering wetlands and sprawling floodplains. Afterwards, follow the Kennedy River to scenic Princess Charlotte Bay, part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and habitat for the dugong. The afternoon is yours - relax at the lodge or join a guided walk through the billabong, where you might spot rare birdlife. **B.L.D**

Departing Lotusbird Lodge, we make our way north along the Peninsula Development Road, passing through Coen before arriving at a bucket list stop Archer River Roadhouse for lunch, one of Australia's northern most roadhouses. We then continue to Weipa, the economic hub of the Cape and often referred to as the 'Barramundi capital of Queensland' due to the abundance of marine life. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Albatross Bay Resort

Day 7: Wildlife Cruise – Batavia Downs – Moreton Telegraph Station

Start the day with a tranquil cruise along the Embley River, spotting diverse wildlife and learning about the region's unique history. Back on land, we visit the Western Cape Cultural Centre before heading deeper into the remote north, passing Batavia Downs and following the historic Telegraph Track to our overnight stay at Moreton Telegraph Station the perfect place to bed down and absorb the wilderness of the Cape. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Moreton Wilderness Lodge

Day 8: Moreton Telegraph Station

Wake up to the sounds of beautiful birdsong and explore the remote landscapes surrounding Moreton Telegraph Station. Join a guided walk along the Wenlock River, home to an extraordinary variety of freshwater fish, including the elusive spear-tooth shark. This afternoon, unwind and enjoy the peace of this secluded haven. **B.L.D**

Day 9: Telegraph Track – Heathlands – Fruit Bat Falls – Bamaga

Our adventure continues along the rugged Telegraph Track, cutting through remote and wild terrain. Some sections of the track are impassable, so we take the northern and southern bypass roads. A highlight of the day is a swim in the crystal-clear waters of Fruit Bat Falls, a true oasis in the outback. After a picnic lunch, we cross the Jardine River by ferry, formally known as Deception River the largest river of the Cape. We arrive in the indigenous town of Bamaga late afternoon and check in to the award-winning Cape York Peninsula Lodge our home the next two nights. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Cape York Peninsula Lodge

Day 10: Bamaga – Pajinka (The Tip)

Today, we venture to the northernmost point on the Australian Mainland, a Cape traveller's ultimate destination. The walking track commences at Pajinka and requires a good level of fitness but is well worth the effort. Have your picture taken next to the iconic signpost and soak up the views of the Torres Strait as your guide fills you in on the history of the area. This afternoon, we visit Somerset, once a significant trading post and with rich Indigenous culture and history. After a BBQ lunch, we return to the hotel where the rest of the day is spent at your leisure. Tonight, experience an engaging performance by a local dance group at the resort. **B.L.D**

Cape York Tip (Pajinka): 2 km, 1.5 hours
The walk is rocky and uneven with some extremely steep slopes and higher difficulty.

Day 11: Endeavour Strait – Thursday Island – Friday Island

Step aboard for a relaxing cruise across Endeavour Strait with informative commentary about the Torres Strait Islands, as we make our way to Thursday Island, affectionately known as Tl. Home to around 3,000 residents, the island serves as the main administrative centre of the Torres Strait. Upon arrival, enjoy a guided tour with a local expert.

A short ferry ride carries us across to Friday Island, one of the more secluded islands and home to Kazu Pearls. Pearl farming started here in the 1860's, where you'll witness a fascinating demonstration before returning to Thursday Island for our overnight stay. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Grand Hotel Thursday Island

Day 12: Horn Island – Cairns

This morning, we catch a ferry across to Horn Island and enjoy a tour of this once prominent WWII air base before visiting the Torres Strait Heritage Museum. We then board our flight back to Cairns, arriving in time for lunch. Tonight, enjoy a special farewell dinner to farewell new friends and reflect upon our incredible adventure to the tip of Australia. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Shangri-La, The Marina

Day 13: Cairns

Day 8: Exploring Pungalina - Seven Emu Sanctuary

Step into the untouched wilderness of Pungalina-Seven Emu Sanctuary, a haven of ecological significance in northern Australia. Explore the pristine landscapes on a guided cruise along the Calvert River, where towering sandstone cliffs and lush riverbanks reveal a side of the outback rarely seen. Gain fascinating insights during an ecology tour led by trained AWC staff, showcasing the vital conservation efforts that protect this extraordinary sanctuary. **B.L.D**

Day 9: Savannah Way - Borroloola - Lorella Springs Wilderness Park

We pass through Limmen National Park before arriving at the turn-off to Lorella Springs. From here, it's a 30km drive to Lorella Springs Wilderness Park, our home for the next three nights. **B.L.D**

Day 10 - Day 11: Exploring Lorella Springs Station

Spend two unforgettable days exploring Lorella Springs Wilderness Park, a 4,000-square-kilometre working cattle station brimming with rugged beauty and natural wonder. This remote outback haven offers a mix of thermal springs, hidden waterfalls, sandstone escarpments and crystal-clear billabongs, all waiting to be discovered.

Whether you're after adventure or relaxation, there's something here for everyone. Wildlife is abundant, with wallabies, vibrant birdlife and freshwater crocodiles adding to the magic.

Highlights of our time here include an exhilarating helicopter flight over the southern 'Lost City', followed by a ground tour to explore its ancient sandstone formations, where your guides will share insights into the geology, flora and fauna of this remarkable region.

Back at the station, unwind at the bar during happy hour and swap stories with fellow travellers, surrounded by the remote serenity of the Gulf. **B.L.D**

Day 12: Lorella Springs - Katherine

As we travel west, the landscape shifts dramatically. We pass through the rugged escarpments and sandstone formations of Limmen National Park, home to striking natural features like the Southern Lost City and a network of rivers and seasonal wetlands teeming with birdlife.

From here, we continue to Roper Bar, a historic crossing of the Roper River and a key outpost for early explorers and pastoralists. After a break here, we turn south, following the Roper Highway through vast, open country dotted with eucalypts and termite mounds.

This evening, we arrive in Katherine, where the red dirt meets the tropics and a two-night stay awaits. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Knotts Crossing Resort

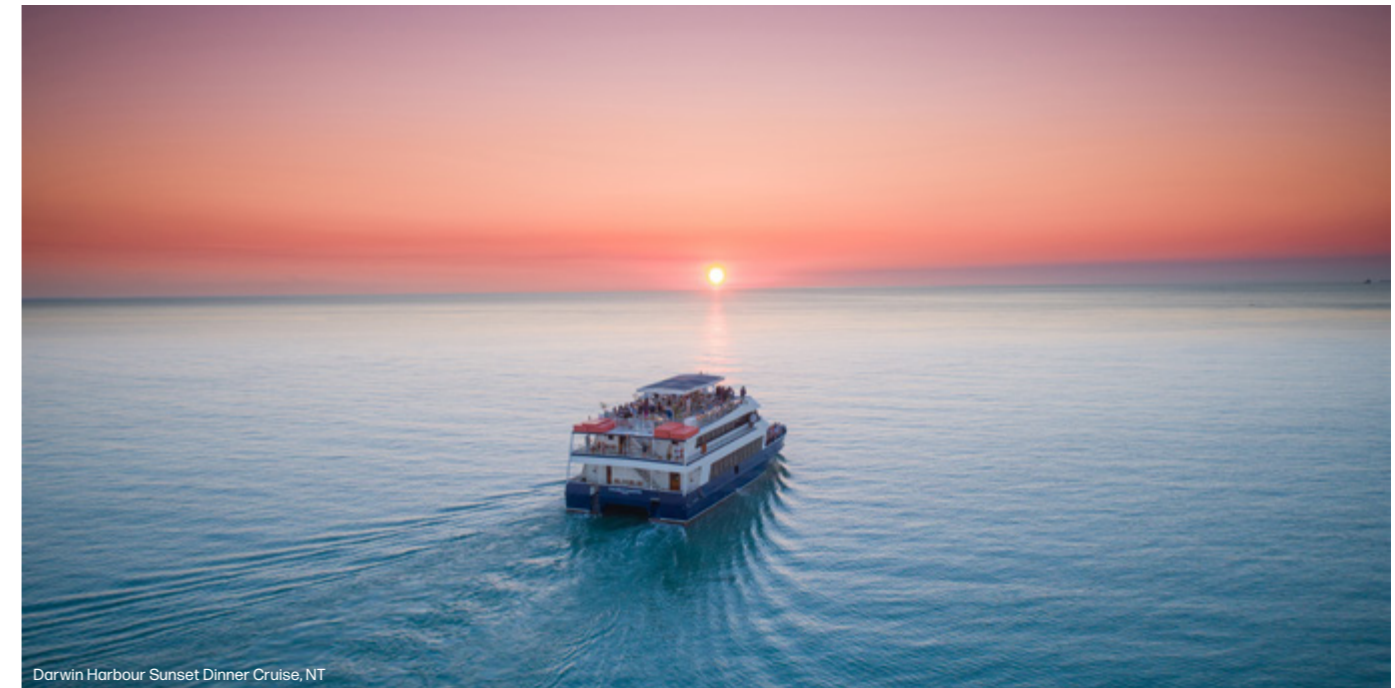

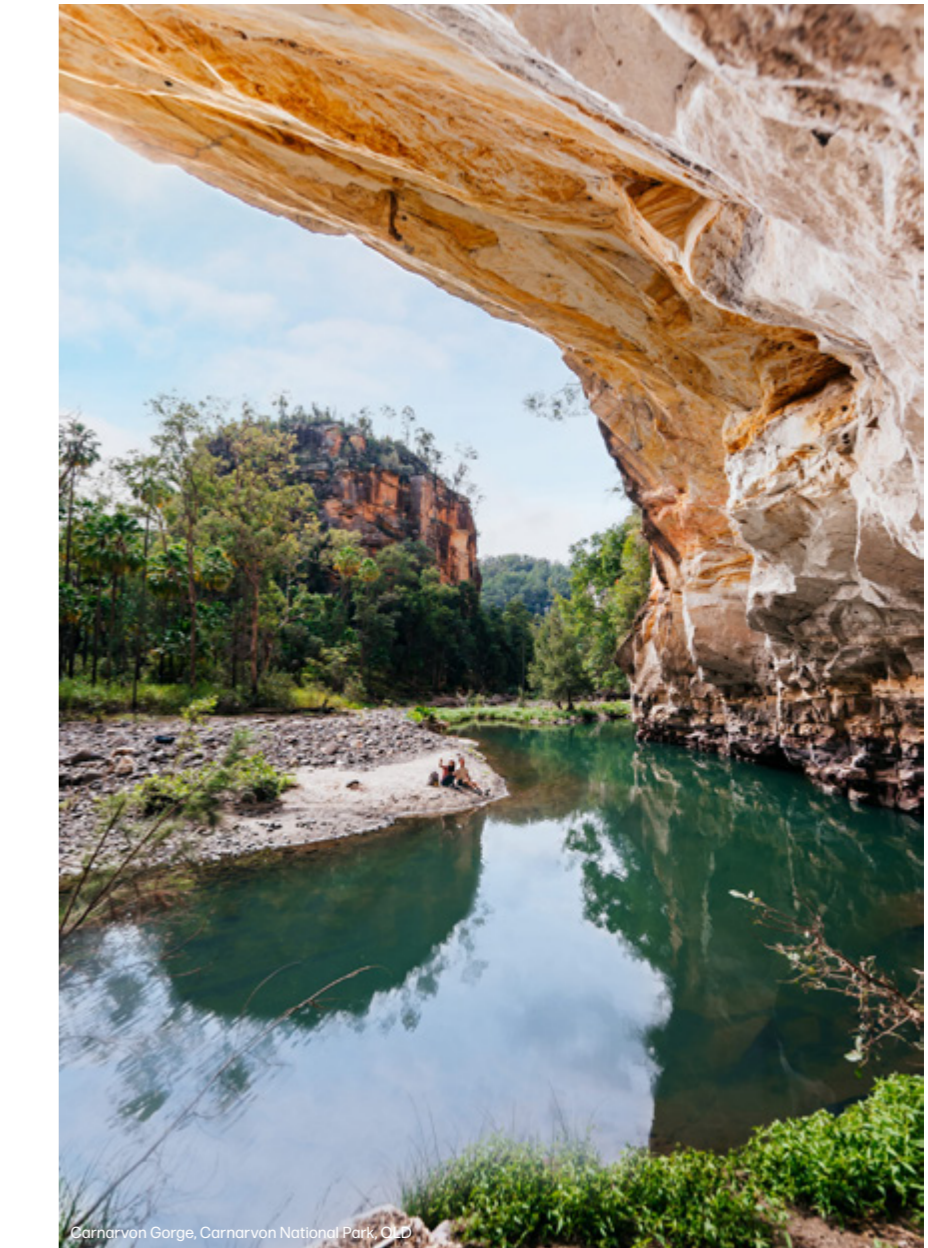

Day 8: Mount Isa - Mine Tour

A guided town tour introduces you to the history and character of Mount Isa, followed by a visit to 'Outback at Isa', home to a fascinating collection of regional experiences. Venture underground on the Hard Times Mine tour, then explore the Riversleigh Fossil Centre, which showcases one of the world's richest fossil sites. Day 9: Mt. Isa - Karumba

Say goodbye to Mt Isa and travel east toward Karumba, pausing in Cloncurry to visit the John Flynn Place Museum. This fascinating collection honours the legacy of Reverend John Flynn, who founded the Aerial Medical Service in 1928, what would later become the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Discover personal memorabilia and early medical equipment that tell the story of Flynn's tireless efforts to bring healthcare to Australia's most remote corners.

The museum also celebrates the ingenuity of Alfred Traeger, whose invention of the pedal-powered radio transformed communication in the outback. As we explore Cloncurry, we also learn how the town took its name from the nearby river, christened by explorer Robert O'Hara Burke in honour of his cousin, Lady Elizabeth Cloncurry.

We continue along the Burke Development Road towards Normanton, stopping at the historic Burke & Wills Roadhouse for morning tea. Here, we reflect on the ill-fated expedition of 1860-61 before arriving in Karumba later this afternoon. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at End of the Road Motel

Day 10: Karumba - Gulflander - Barramundi Centre

Joining one of the great characters of rail travel - 'The Gulflander' is a perfect start to our day. This historic little train takes us on a journey from Normanton to Critters Camp*. Later, we discover the secrets of the mighty barramundi at The Les Wilson Barramundi Discovery Centre.

Tonight, we enjoy a special Sand Island sunset dinner cruise in the Gulf. We'll dine on local seafood while watching a sensational gulf sunset. **B.L.D**

Day 11: Normanton - Cobbold Gorge

Leaving the Gulf town of Karumba behind, we travel inland across the vast savannah plains of Queensland's outback.

As we travel through remote cattle country, the landscape gradually shifts to rugged sandstone escarpments and ancient riverbeds, signalling our approach to the spectacular Cobbold Gorge region.

This hidden gem, carved over millennia, awaits with its striking narrow chasms and tranquil waterways, a dramatic contrast to the open plains we've just crossed. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Cobbold Village

Day 12: Exploring Cobbold Gorge

This morning, join a 3-hour Savannah-guided tour of Cobbold Gorge. Begin with a circular interpretive walk to the escarpment, taking in panoramic views before crossing the striking glass bridge suspended above the gorge. Then step aboard custom-made, near-silent electric boats for a peaceful cruise through the narrow sandstone chasms and still waterholes that make this place so unique.

After lunch, set out on a guided station tour to experience life on a working cattle station, complete with a traditional 'smoko' along the way. Later, return to Cobbold Village for a relaxing final night in this remarkable outback setting. **B.L.D**

Day 13: Cobbold Gorge - Undara Lava Tubes

Back in town, explore the Sulphide Street Railway Museum and wander the Living Desert Reserve, where sandstone sculptures rise from the red earth. **B.L.D**

Day 6: Milparinka - Depot Glen - Tibooburra

Perched high on the mullock heap, the Line of Lode Miners Memorial offers a sweeping view over Broken Hill and a solemn reminder of the 800-plus miners who lost their lives below ground.

From here, the Silver City Highway leads us north to Milparinka. Once a bustling gold rush outpost, this tiny town now quietly tells its stories through beautifully restored buildings like the old courthouse and police barracks.

We continue west to Depot Glen, a remote, windswept waterhole where explorer Charles Sturt and his party were stranded for months in 1845, waiting for the relentless outback heat to subside.

Passing through Eromanga, we arrive at our destination late afternoon. Toogunna Plains is a fifth-generation family-owned 130,000-acre sheep and cattle property, and our exclusive home for the next two nights.

This afternoon we take in the unique outback landscape in an incredible Sunset at Sandhills tour with cheese platters and drinks. We then return to the property for dinner under the stars and around the campfire. **B.L.D**

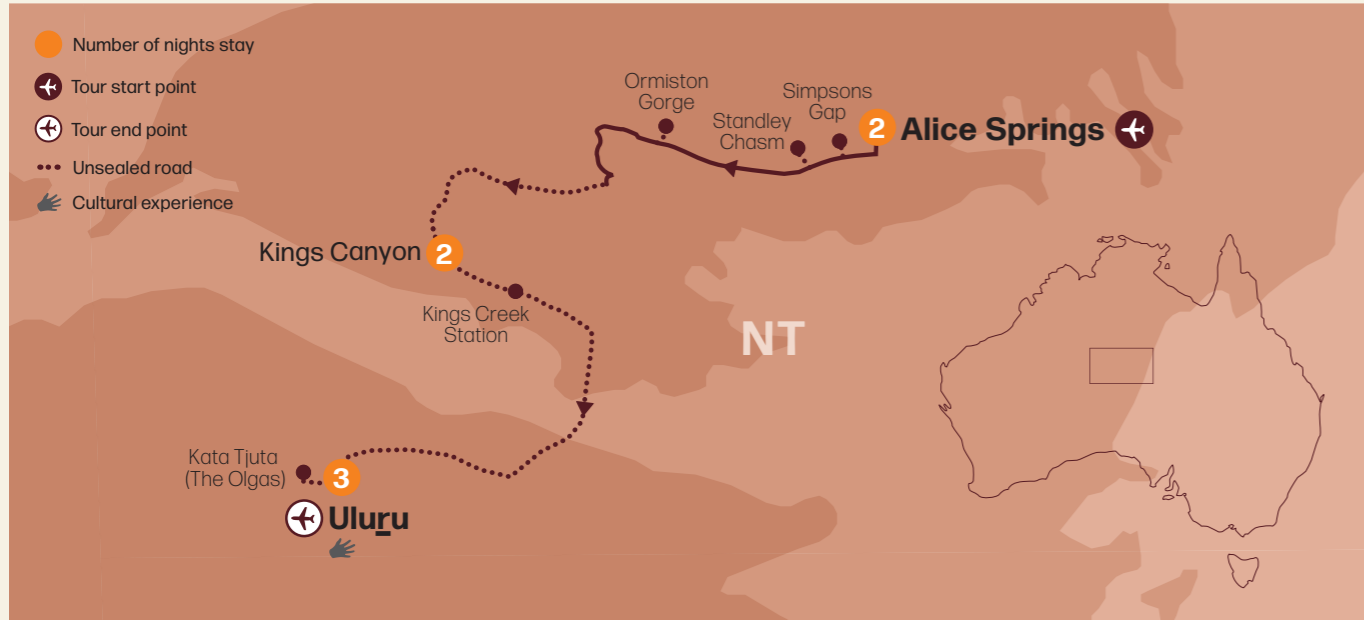

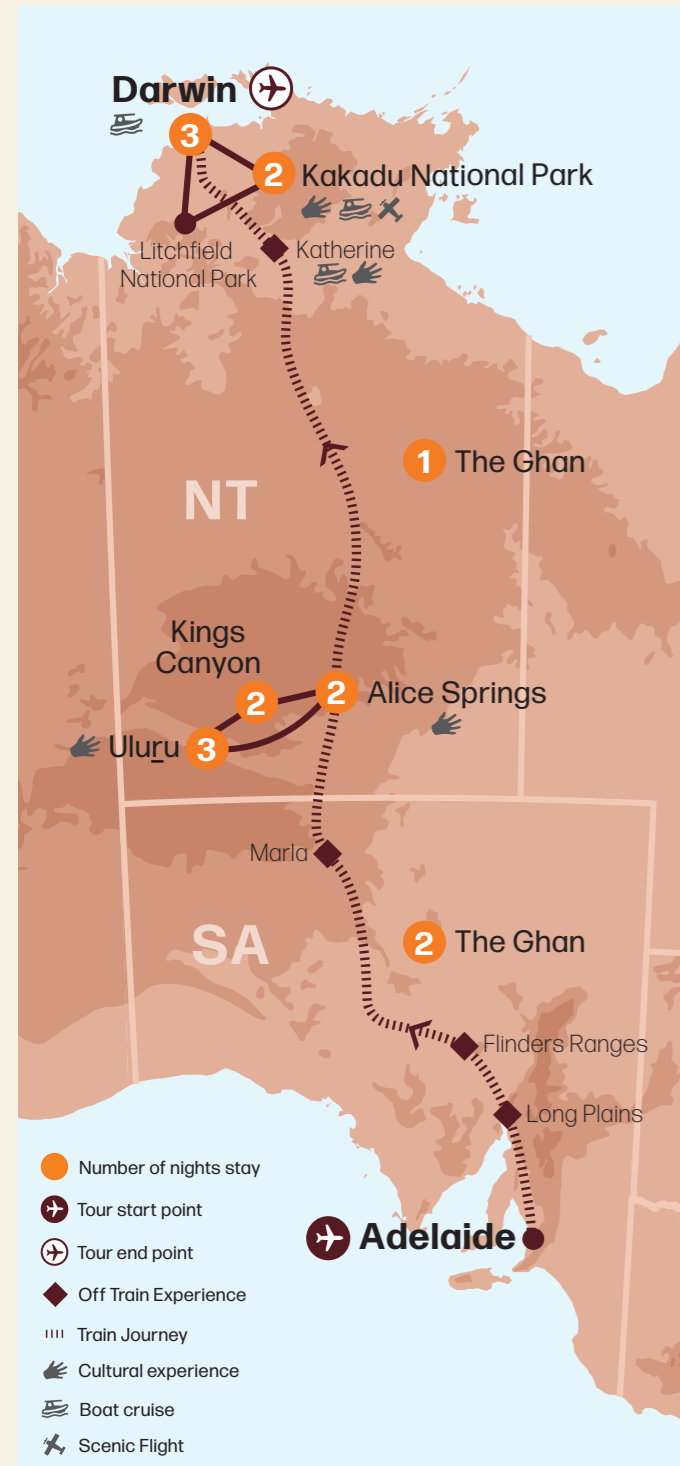

Discover the heart of the Pilbara today as continue west, to venture into the spectacular Millstream-Chichester National Park, a landscape of rugged escarpments, spring-fed pools and tree-lined rivers. 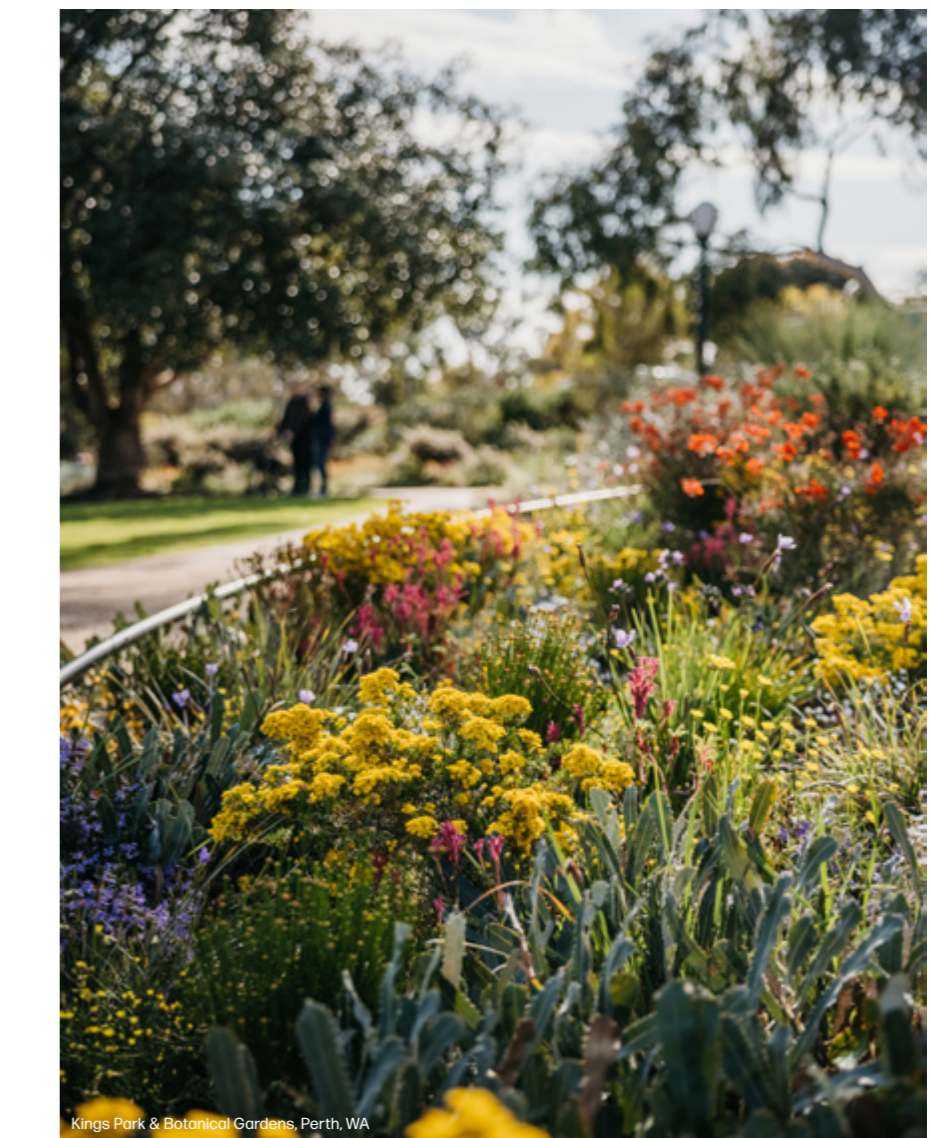

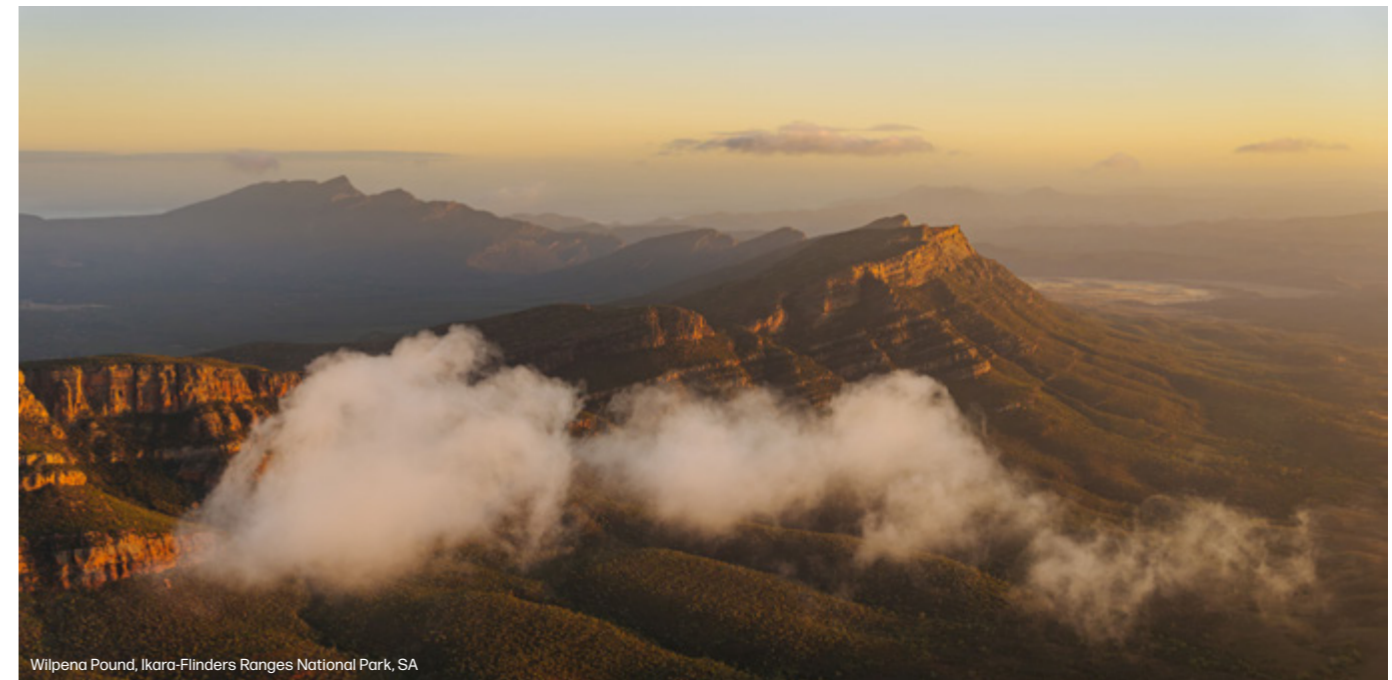

Day 6: Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre - Kalamurina Wildlife Sanctuary

Take to the skies this morning for a scenic flight over the vast expanse of Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre. Follow the Warburton Groove north to Kalamurina Wildlife Sanctuary, where we touch down for a guided tour on the banks of the Warburton Creek. Learn how this once-pastoral station has been transformed into a vital conservation area.

Later, return by coach along the Birdsville Track, crossing Cooper Creek en route to Marree. **B.L.D**

In Port Augusta, the Arid Lands Botanic Gardens provides insight into the miracle of life in the outback and the survival of highly evolved adaptive plant communities. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Standpipe Golf Motor Inn

Day 10: Port Augusta - Adelaide

Our destination today is the Clare Valley, a celebrated South Australian wine region well known for its Riesling but also produces exceptional Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz. These varieties account for nearly half of the wine produced in the area. After a scenic drive through rolling vineyards and heritage towns, we'll stop at a local winery for lunch and tastings.

Returning to Adelaide, we gather for dinner, raising a glass to moments shared in outback South Australia. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Majestic M Suites

Day 11: Adelaide - Kangaroo Island

Please note: This is the start of the Kangaroo Island extension. Guests concluding the 11-day tour will be transferred to Adelaide Airport or their city hotel.

At Remarkable Rocks, admire the massive granite boulders, sculpted by nature into abstract forms perched high above the crashing surf. At Cape du Couedic, explore the historic lighthouse before venturing to Admiral's Arch. Here, stalactites hang dramatically from the ceiling of the rocky archway, often silhouetted against the cobalt sea while New Zealand fur seals sprawl across the shoreline below. **B.L.D**

Seal Bay Beach Walk: 800 m, 1.5 hours

The walk is sandy with around 20 stairs leading down to the beach.

Remarkable Rocks: 600 m, 45 min

The walk starts on a boardwalk before becoming rocky, steep, and uneven.

Admiral's Arch: 800 m, 1 hour

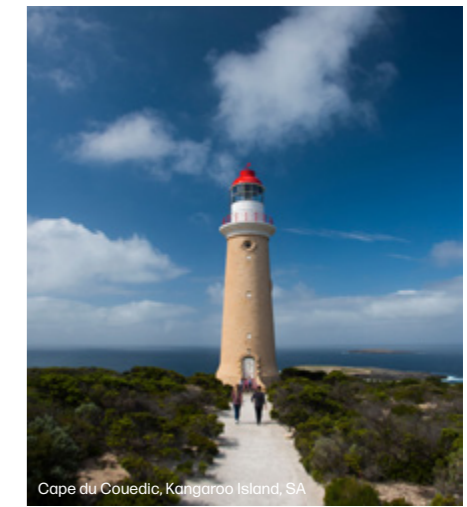

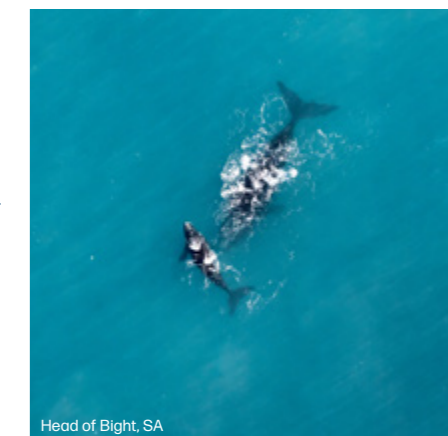

Your Journey

Day 1: Hobart - Port Arthur

The Tasmanian adventure begins mid-morning as we depart Hobart for Port Arthur. A visit to the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Port Arthur Historic Site sets the tone, offering a sobering and fascinating insight into Australia's penal past. Take a guided tour of the former convict settlement and enjoy a harbour cruise around the Isle of the Dead. This evening, share a welcome dinner with your fellow travellers. **L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Port Arthur Motor Inn

Day 2: Port Arthur - Freycinet National Park

Take in the beauty of Tasmania's east coast as we travel north along the scenic Tasman Highway, stopping first at the historic village of Richmond. Known for its convict-era architecture and home to Australia's oldest bridge, built in 1823, Richmond offers a charming glimpse into Tasmania's colonial past.

We continue through the coastal towns of Orford and Swansea, enjoying glimpses of white sand beaches and turquoise bays, before venturing down the Freycinet Peninsula. Here, a rewarding walk leads us to breathtaking views from the Wineglass Bay lookout, one of the most photographed views in the country.

This evening, we check in to Freycinet Lodge and dine at the acclaimed Dove Restaurant, overlooking the calm waters of Great Oyster Bay. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Freycinet Lodge

Wineglass Bay Lookout: 3 km, 2 hours
The walk is steep and rocky with many uneven steps.

Day 3: Wineglass Bay - Woolmers Estate - Launceston

Begin the day with a visit to Cape Tourville Lighthouse, where sweeping views stretch across the rugged coastline and out over the Tasman Sea. From here, we take to the skies on an exclusive 20-minute scenic flight over Freycinet National Park, soaking up a breathtaking bird's-eye view of Wineglass Bay and the striking pink granite peaks that tumble into the water below.

Later, we farewell the coast and travel on to Launceston, stopping at Woolmers Estate in Longford, one of Australia's most intact pioneer farm complexes and a fascinating step back in time.

Tonight, we settle in at Peppers Silo Hotel before enjoying a memorable dinner at Grain of the Silos, showcasing the very best of Tasmanian produce. **B.L.D**

Stay: 1 night at Peppers Silo Hotel

Day 4: Launceston - Stanley - Smithton

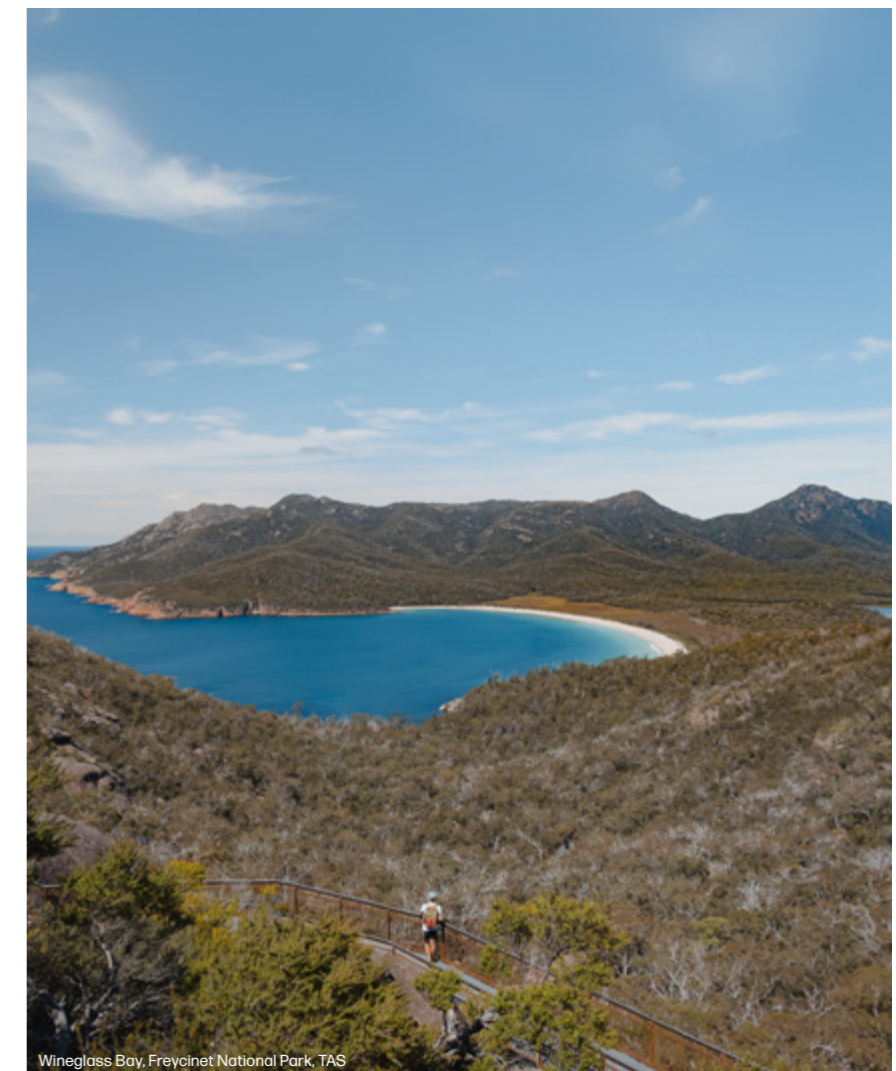
Follow the scenic Bass Highway west through the charming towns of Ulverstone, Penguin, and Burnie before arriving in Stanley, home to 'The Nut'. If weather permits, we'll take the chairlift to the top for stunning views over Bass Strait. The more active among us, may choose to tackle the very steep ascent on foot.

Stanley was once the administrative centre for the Van Diemen's Land Company, a royal charter company formed in 1824 during the reign of King George IV. A visit to Highfield House, the company's original headquarters, helps bring this history to life. We then continue to Smithton, where we spend the night. **B.L.D**

Day 5: Woolnorth - Cradle Mountain

Start the day with a journey through Tasmania's rich agricultural north-west to historic Woolnorth Station. This 200-year-old property spans wild, wind-battered coastline and is home to Cape Grim, the cleanest air in the world, and the state's largest wind farm. Take a guided tour of the station, learn about its pioneering history, and enjoy breathtaking views across the rugged coast.

Later, venture inland towards Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park, a World Heritage-listed wilderness of alpine peaks, ancient rainforest and glacial lakes. Check in and settle into our accommodation, nestled among towering eucalypts and mountain air. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Cradle Mountain Lodge

Day 6: Cradle Mountain Exploration

Discover the area's early tourism pioneers with a visit to Waldheim Chalet, a replica of the original built by Gustav and Kate Weindorfer in 1912 as we venture to Dove Lake, a glacier-carved jewel at the foot of Cradle Mountain. Choose to take the 5.7 km circuit walk that hugs the shoreline for immersive views of the dramatic landscape, or enjoy shorter nature trails at your own pace. For those preferring a gentler experience, after we return to the hotel to unwind, explore the nearby Enchanted Walk, a 45-minute loop through mossy forest and alpine flora. Late this afternoon, indulge in a local tasting experience featuring some of Tasmania's finest cheeses and cool-climate wines. **B.L.D**

Dove Lake: 6 km, 3 hours

The walk has uneven surfaces, long sections of boardwalk, and many steps both up and down.

Day 7: Cradle Mountain - Strahan

Leaving the alpine highlands behind, we wind our way west through dense forest and historic mining towns. Our first stop is Queenstown, where a guided town tour reveals stories of copper mines, environmental resilience and the bold personalities who shaped the region.

From here, descend into the remote harbour-side village of Strahan. With its historic buildings, quiet harbour, and laid-back charm, Strahan is one of Tasmania's most captivating destinations. Enjoy some free time this afternoon to explore the village or stroll along the foreshore before dinner. **B.L.D**

Stay: 2 nights at Strahan Village Motel

Day 8: Gordon River Cruise

Step aboard the purpose-built 'Spirit of the Wild' for an unforgettable cruise deep into the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area. With its whisper-quiet hybrid engine, the vessel glides effortlessly through the pristine waters of the Gordon River.

Disembark for two guided shore excursions, one at Heritage Landing for a walk through ancient rainforest, and the other at Sarah Island, a notorious penal settlement with a fascinating history. Enjoy a premium lunch onboard as we cruise through Hells Gates, where the river meets the untamed Southern Ocean.

Return to Strahan in the afternoon and take the rest of the day at your leisure. Perhaps visit the Huon Pine Sawmill for a fascinating demonstration or browse the local craft shops and galleries. **B.L.D**

Day 9: Lake St Clair - Russell Falls - Hobart

Departing early, we begin our journey across the island's wild interior. Our route takes us through the remote wilderness of Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park, where dense rainforest and wild rivers define the landscape.

Stop at Lake St Clair, Australia's deepest freshwater lake, before continuing to Derwent Bridge for a visit to the Wall in the Wilderness—an extraordinary, hand-carved sculpture telling the story of Tasmania's highlands through timber.

We then journey on to Mt Field National Park and take a short walk to see the picture-perfect Russell Falls, framed by giant tree ferns and ancient sassafras. Later, arrive into Hobart and settle in for the next three nights. **B.L.D**

Day 10: Hobart - Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary - Royal Botanic Gardens

ALICE SPRINGS Telegraph Station

A walk through history.



The Alice Springs Telegraph Station Historical Reserve marks the original site of the first European settlement in Alice Springs.

Established in 1871 to relay messages between Darwin and Adelaide along the Overland Telegraph Line which connected Australia's population centres with the north of the country and Britain using the undersea telegraph network. Before the telegraph line was built, a message to England would have to travel by boat, taking 3-4 months each way. After the telegraph line was built, morse code messages could reach London in as little as 5 hours - slow by today's standards, but revolutionary for people of the 19th century.

The Historic Museum

Join a guided tour through the heritage museum and precinct to immerse yourself in the history of the Telegraph Station, the origins of Alice Springs as a town and the Stolen Generation of the Bungalow era of the 1930s. Travel back in time, and explore the inner workings of the original Telegraph Station and Post Office, as well as experience a working display of Meidinger batteries - replicas of those that powered the Overland Telegraph Line back in the 1870s - unique to the southern hemisphere.

Important Information



Luggage Limits

To ensure comfort for all guests, and due to restricted space on coach, strict luggage limits are enforced on all Outback Spirit tours. These restrictions are in place to ensure fairness for all guests and to comply with Australian Work Health and Safety Regulations for our crew, and must be adhered to by all passengers. Any luggage that exceeds the specific allowance will need to be repacked.

General Luggage Allowance

- One medium-sized bag (up to 16 kg)
- One small carry-on item (up to 3 kg)
- Medium bag dimensions must not exceed 140 cm (L + W + D)

Exceptions for Specific Tours

For the Seven Spirit Bay and Eyre Peninsula Whale & Seafood Discovery tours, the medium-sized bag limit is 15 kg. The same 140 cm combined dimension rule applies.

CPAP Machines (Sleep Apnoea)

If you're travelling with a CPAP machine, it must be included within your total luggage allowance and carried in your hand luggage. Most of our lodges provide 240v power, however we recommend bringing a fully charged travel battery as a backup.

Mobility and Fitness

Outback Spirit tours require a moderate level of mobility. Please consider the following before booking:

- Guests must be able to board and disembark high-clearance 4WD coaches without assistance. Steps are higher than standard vehicles, but boarding is unhurried, with grab rails for support.
- Wheelchairs, walkers and mobility aids cannot be accommodated due to space limitations. Coaches are not fitted with lifts or ramps.
- Some walks may include uneven, rocky or steep terrain, which can be slippery in certain weather conditions. Walks are optional, and for guests who prefer not to join, we will provide alternative arrangements to ensure comfort and safety.
- Portage is not always available in all destinations; therefore, we kindly ask guests to be prepared to carry their own luggage to and from the coach.
- Our staff are trained in first aid and can offer medical assistance for minor issues. Guests requiring help with mobility must travel with a capable companion.
- Many tours travel through remote areas, far from immediate medical support. If you're unsure about your fitness to travel, please contact us before booking.

Dietary Requirements

Enjoy the convenience of an all-inclusive experience, with all meals and beverages included in your Outback Spirit tour fare.

We're able to accommodate most health and dietary requirements when advised at the time of booking or at least six weeks prior to travel. While we aim to fulfil all special requests, availability may vary in some locations due to their remote, rural setting.

Medical Emergency

Please advise us of any medical requirements prior to travel, including mobility limitations, allergies, CPAP use, or other health concerns. A Health & Fitness form is included in your tour documents and should be handed to your Tour Director on day one. This information is treated confidentially and used only in emergencies.

Many tours visit remote regions, where access to medical facilities may be limited. Guests acknowledge this as part of the experience. Our crew are first-aid trained and equipped with first aid kits, and in the event of a serious incident, assistance will be arranged promptly through the nearest medical facility. In rare cases requiring evacuation, the Royal Flying Doctor Service may be called upon and operates on a donation basis. Our Operations Team is available 24/7 to support in emergencies.

Wi-Fi & Reception

All Outback Spirit coaches are fitted with Starlink Wi-Fi, providing internet access even in some of Australia's most remote locations. However, connectivity can vary depending on the tour. In regions such as the Kimberley, Arnhem Land and Cape York, mobile reception may be limited or unavailable, and accommodation in these areas may offer intermittent service.

Please note, satellite communications onboard are for operational use only and not accessible to guests. Your final tour documents include an accommodation list indicating Wi-Fi availability at each property.

Travel Insurance

We strongly recommend travel insurance for your peace of mind. It helps protect against the unexpected and ensures support in case of illness, delays, or cancellations. Outback Spirit can provide a quote at the time of booking if required.

Best Time to Travel

Peak travel in the outback and Top End is during winter and the shoulder seasons of late autumn and spring. Cooler destinations like Tasmania are best visited in spring and summer.

Time on Coach

Travel time on board the coach varies depending on itinerary. Australia is a big country, so there may be some full-day drives and early starts. In these situations, we endeavour to stop every 2-3 hours for rest breaks, tea/coffee/snacks and points of interest. We also have a daily seat rotation system in place, so you can enjoy a different view throughout the tour.

Facilities on Coach

All Outback Spirit coaches are purpose-built for remote touring, offering comfort and convenience no matter how far off the beaten track you go. On board, you'll find restroom facilities, reclining seats with generous legroom, USB charging ports, a television and media player, a road cam and P.A. system, as well as Starlink Wi-Fi (connectivity may vary depending on your location). Coaches also feature onboard refrigeration, a drinking water supply, a hot water urn for tea and coffee, a comprehensive first-aid kit, and a satellite communication system used for operational purposes.

Scenic & Transfer Flights

Some tours include flight transfers and scenic experiences by fixed-wing aircraft or helicopter. Tour maps highlight all flying elements, including scenic flights. Please note that maximum passenger weight limits apply on all flights, ranging from 120 kg to 136 kg, depending on the specific tour and the aircraft's safety requirements for balanced loading.
